My vows are identical to the vows taken by elders and deacons, with a special addition of this one (W-4.4003):

Will you be a faithful minister, proclaiming the good news in Word and sacrament, teaching faith and caring for people? Will you be active in government and discipline, serving in the governing bodies of the church, and in your ministry will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ?

I will.

These promises are made with the intent of showing we all take our call seriously. They demonstrate that our relationship is tender and important. Now it's time to begin. The call has been given, and with great delight we shall embrace it.

SYMBOLS of our faith...Symbols of the Twelve Apostles

The twelve Apostles chosen by Jesus to be His special representatives were "Peter, James the son of Zebedee, John the brother of James, Andrew, Philip, Bartholomew, Matthew, Thomas, James the son of Alphaeus, Thaddaeus, Simon the Canaanite, and Judas Iscariot" Mark 3:16-19. They are frequently represented by symbols.



Thaddaeus and Jude are considered to be one and the same. Very little is said about him in the Bible other than the listing of his name as one of the chosen twelve. In the gospels Mark calls him Thaddeus, Matthew calls him "Lebbeus, whose last name was Thaddeus" and Luke names him Judas, the brother of James. He was evidently very active in the work of the early church and is said to have preached in Syria, Arabia and Mesopotamia. According to tradition, it is said that this apostle traveled far on missionary journeys in company with Simon; thus he is represented with a sailing ship on his shield.

**PW MISSIONS** 

Our PW Mission emphasis for the coming year will be helping to care for vulnerable children in Kamwenge, Uganda by donating funds for educational needs and school supplies.

Kamwenge Vocational School is a community school in the heart of rural Uganda with a vision to transform this poor community into a self-sustained and responsible one with a high sense of integrity and accountability in a Christian transforming environment.

The school is located on 20 acres of land in the district of Kamwenge, western Uganda. This area has a population of 300,000 people, mostly refugees from neighboring countries, and is considered one of the poorest in Uganda. Parents cannot afford to send their children to school and do not understand the importance of education. This illiteracy has increased the cycle of HIV/AIDS and poverty. The Kamwenge School aims to equip individuals with skills for sustainable socio-economic development, a holistic approach of building the Kingdom of God.







Key Dates for the Upcoming Census

2010 is a special year—it's a "census" year. The first census was conducted in 1790 and has been carried out every 10 years since. By participating in the census, you will help ensure that the City of Duncanville, or the city you live in, gets its fair share of federal and state funding. Locally, census information helps determine locations for schools, roads, hospitals, child-care and senior centers, and much more. Businesses also use census data to determine new locations for supermarkets, shopping centers, housing and other facilities. So, watch your mailbox and return your census questionnaire in a timely fashion. It's important to you and your community.

March 2010	Census questionnaires mailed or delivered to households.
April 1, 2010	Census Day
April—July 2010	Census takers visit households that did not return a questionnaire by mail.
December 2010	Census Bureau delivers population counts to the President.
