Dave Liddle writes us this month.

Life here in Germany is pretty normal, as life goes. Any of you who came to visit would no doubt find that our setting is quite different -- a collection of villages nestled inside a valley -- but that the daily motion of life is not entirely unlike the way it is in the United States.

The biggest change to life this year has been Katherine taking a bigger role in the library maintained on the Wycliffe Germany campus. She is, in fact, now heading the small collection of linguistic and missiological resources that are available to Wycliffe members who need them. Some of these people are on furlough or study leaves, while others are people who live in Germany but serve language groups located in other countries or regions. Katherine works with a former language survey colleague, Angela Kluge, who is now in charge of the training program hosted by Wycliffe Germany. They have been quite occupied lately, identifying new books that will be useful to our brothers and sisters for training and further study.

As for me, I've been working slowly but steadily this year in finding ways to simplify the IT services we provide to about ten different locations throughout Europe. I took a course in wireless networking in England last spring that's helping to make it easier to supply offices with a much-demanded service. I have consulted several times now with people who are concerned about wireless Internet access at conference and retreat centers -- places where they hold workshops and seminars on Bible translation and related matters.

Much like my last few years in the Dallas office, Wycliffe and SIL began a massive project to change email systems again. This time, everyone in the world is switching from our in-house system to one that is hosted by Google. Here in Europe, the matter is complicated by each office beginning to use their own domains -- that is, the last part of the email address, e.g. <u>wycliffe.nl</u>. We have to make a lot of behind-the-scenes arrangements to the process to go smoothly, and we don't always get things right the first time.

After the summer break, during which we met Katherine's family in Scotland for a vacation (pictures), Jonathan and Caleb began 7th and 6th grade. They like school about as well as you expect most kids to like it, but they are doing well under Katherine's watchful eye. Their after-school activities are something they enjoy more, though. Each of them takes part in a church youth group, and they both play volleyball at the recreation center here in Niederdresselndorf (knee-dare-DRESS-eln-dorf). When we're together -- and it's not raining -- we like to ride our bikes on the paths here.

We miss the faces and friendship of our family there, and we wish you all "Frohe Weihnachten!"

Cook's Corner

This month, Jocelyn Bolles shares with us her favorite recipe for wintry weather. Enjoy!

Here's a good recipe for the cold weather:

Chili con carne (northern style) for the troops:

- 3 lbs ground chuck (browned and drained)
- 3 cans (15 oz) diced tomatoes
- 3 cans (15 oz) tomato sauce
- 2 cans (15 oz) dark red kidney beans (3 cans if you are partial to kidney beans)
- 1 cup diced onions
- 1 cup diced green pepper (optional)
- 2 tablespoons Worchester sauce
- 3+ tablespoons chili powder (seasoned to your liking)


Brown and drain the ground chuck, and add to all other ingredients. Serves about 15-18, depending on the troops.

Works well as a last-minute supper (can be ready in less than a half hour) or you can put in the slow cooker in the morning to serve that night.

In the North, we serve as a main dish with macaroni or rice; here in Texas, it's more like Frito pies or with chips and crackers, your choice!
