

SYMBOLS of our faith...Symbols of the Twelve Apostles

From the Worship Team

The twelve Apostles chosen by Jesus to be His special representatives were "Peter, James the son of Zebedee, John the brother of James, Andrew, Philip, Bartholomew, Matthew, Thomas, James the son of Alphaeus, Thaddaeus, Simon the Canaanite, and Judas Iscariot." Mark 3:16-19 They are frequently represented by symbols.



Matthew was a tax collector before he became one of the appointed twelve disciples. His symbol is usually an object that refers to that Vocation: money bags, coins or purses. In the days of Jesus, tax collectors were among the most hated men in society. The taxes went to support the Romans who had taken over the land of Israel. Some Jews, trying to make the best of things, joined with the Romans and got some of the tax money as their salary. But they were hated by their fellow Jews, and were not even allowed to attend worship. One day, the outcast Matthew was surprised to hear the teacher, Jesus of Nazareth call him, "Follow me." Matthew did.

Finance

FINANCE

We made it through August and all the repairs that went with it. The final bills for the air conditioners were paid in early September, totaling \$18,694. So even though we ended the month of August with just over \$21,100 in the bank, most of it was already spent. Total repairs not counting the roof were \$22,330 for which you have given a total of \$7,190. That leaves us with a balance of \$15,140 on the current repairs. The roof must also be fixed and is not included in this figure.

On the lighter side, God continues to bless the church with increased contributions. Through August giving was up over 16% from last year and almost 10% over what was pledged for this year. Well done and keep it up!

Speaking of pledges, this year's annual Stewardship Campaign begins with the hopes and dreams of the Session for significant ministry. We invite all ministry teams to give input on what you hope to accomplish for next year. Stewardship Campaign kicks off in November. Please give your thoughts about next year's planned spending to the responsible (and committed!) Session member.

On our shelves in our apartment in East Asia, our kids have a photo book which you gave them with pictures of all the kids in Sunday School at First Presby. We also had visits from you through people like Lois Harmon. So you were on our minds.

Our work in East Asia these past years has progressed well. Many good things have happened that we did not do ourselves. You now have many Zee brothers and sisters in East Asia. We know that God is at work. And we know that He chooses to work in response to the prayers of His people---you.

Thank you. Walking into the Sunday service a few weeks ago, we were amazed at how many friends we saw all in one room---people who have known us for 20 years, listened to us, helped us get married, and taught our toddlers. Now we are together again.

We plan on being in Duncanville for one school year and then return to East Asia. Our kids are enjoying having classmates who speak English, eating foods like hamburgers and nachos, and enjoying wonderful things about the U.S. like parks and libraries. Dennis and Susan will continue to work on our Zee language data, take care of medical and other business that we haven't been able to do while overseas, and work with the offices at the International Linguistic Center.

We are currently trying to buy a house here in Duncanville. We have never bought a house and the process is somewhat daunting. We wish to walk in right paths and do what makes God happy.

Our PW Mission emphasis for the coming year will be helping to care for vulnerable children in Kamwenge, Uganda by donating funds for educational needs and school supplies.

Kamwenge Vocational School is a community school in the heart of rural Uganda with a vision to transform this poor community into a self-sustained and responsible one with a high sense of integrity and accountability in a Christian transforming environment.



The school is located on 20 acres of land in the district of Kamwenge, western Uganda. This area has a population of 300,000 people, mostly refugees from neighboring countries, and is considered one of the poorest in Uganda. Parents can not afford to send their children to school and do not understand the importance of education. This illiteracy has increased the cycle of HIV/AIDS and poverty. The Kamwenge School aims to equip individuals with skills for sustainable socio-economic development, a holistic approach of building the Kingdom of God.

How You Can Help! We will be accepting donations toward this cause at our Circle Meetings through the year and also designating a portion of our PW fundraisers toward this project. Our two PW fundraisers are the Spring Plant and Bake Sale and the PW Family Spaghetti Supper and Christmas Auction. We hope you will prayerfully consider joining with us to help these Ugandan families build a better life through education and hopefully to see the love of Jesus Christ through our generosity and concern.


