One third of the world's population can be reached within a 2.5 hour flight radius of Chiang Mai, Thailand. We are in a very strategic place for the job we are doing. However, sometimes it doesn't feel "missionary" enough. After all we have malls, supermarkets, reliable electricity and running water ... Truth is, we had a certain pride in being able to "rough it" on the "front lines" in Niger. Our work here is behind the scenes: serving others in the background. The reality is that despite the façade of materialism, we are living in an area of the world where the message of Christ has had very little impact. Pray for us to be faithful in the "little" things, doing "all to the glory of God".

This summer, while many of our colleagues were in their home countries, both of us filled in at the university, teaching introductory linguistics classes. It was challenging to figure out how to teach a lot of material in a short amount of time to students with a wide range of educational backgrounds from many different countries and languages.

Carlos is getting closer to finishing his PhD dissertation. We are grateful that his study program is free and that he has no required residency or course work because of his many years of field work. This semester Carlos is learning to teach a translation practicum class and continues to work with the translation team in Niger on the book of Luke. 

Caryn enjoys multi-tasking, too: becoming literate in Thai, working as personnel administrator for MA students, and exploring ways to help translation teams help communities to engage

with Scripture in relevant and life-changing


ways.

#### DOM's Thrifty Station


- > The thrift store is open to the public and is their main source of revenue to support the entire operation.


- Monetary

#### **Austin Street Center**



Austin Street Center has become nationally recognized for its unique therapeutic program for the homeless. Not only does the Center offer safe, clean shelter and an evening meal for over 300 men and women each night, but it provides substance abuse treatment, medical and psychiatric care, adult rehabilitation, a transitional living facility for clients who qualify, and a beautiful interdenominational Chapel.

On the **4**<sup>th</sup> **Monday of each month**, FPCD has been providing the center with sandwiches for well over 30 years. A loaf of bread will make a dozen sandwiches (please no mayo or mustard on the sandwiches). Sandwiches should be at the church by 6:30 on the designated Monday.
