From our Pastor

A friend sent an e-mail in response to my invitation to coffee. "I'd love to. I just don't have time right now, maybe next Friday." I looked at my schedule. Oops, I don't have time that day . . . She's right. I feel her pain. We schedule our time until there's hardly enough room to sit down and take an extra breath. And time marches on, stopped only by our end. Know how I feel?

The Bible seems obsessed with time. Sometimes things happen after what seems an eternity, like Elizabeth and Zachariah becoming pregnant after years of barrenness. Or, God waiting for what seemed like forever to send Jesus, even though prophets predicted His coming for years. Or, the Psalmist pleading with God, "Make haste to save me" (Psalm 40:13), as if to say, and don't be a moment too late, please!

God is never early. We might judge Him, like Mary and Martha, *Lord, if only you had been here!* But, if we looked back, we might not be too pleased with how we ourselves have spent our time being there with or for Him.

Time marks a very important element of the Advent season. Paul writes, "But when the right time came, God sent his Son . . . in order to redeem those who were under the law, so that he could adopt us as his very own children. And because we are his children, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, prompting us to call out, "Abba, Father"

(Galatians 4:4-6).

God has moved into our time; adopted our time; changed His schedule to be here with us to redeem us. When God raised Jesus from the dead, God miraculously and wondrously broke forever the claim of time on us. God gave us what we could never have without Jesus – eternal time.

So how will you spend your time this Advent season? Rushing about with no thought of the Gift you have been given? How about recapturing God's view of time? Jesus Christ has interrupted my life and yours. I would like to stop and allow Him to take some time from me; let Him disrupt my life for Him. Perhaps it is the right way to keep time.

Symbols of our Faith: HOLLY



In Christian folklore the prickly leaves of Christmas holly trees came to be associated with Jesus' crown of thorns, while their berries represented the drops of blood shed for humanity's salvation. This symbolism can be found, for example, in the Christmas carol, "The Holly and the Ivy". Christian folklore also identified Christmas holly wood as the wood used to build Jesus' holy cross. In fact, many of us, including some scholars, connect the English words "holly" and "holy," although they probably started out as two separate words..

Missions News ~ From Carol Orwig


"I'm a Language and Culture Learning Consultant for SIL and other partner organizations of Wycliffe Bible Translators. This assignment takes me all over the world, usually for trips of a week or two up to a couple of months at a time. What does a Language and Culture Learning Consultant do? One of my main jobs is to give pre-field training to people who want to



be missionaries. We don't teach them any particular language, but we do teach them how to learn a language, and also ways in which cultures differ, and how this can affect relationships and communication. This year I taught a course in England at which we had students from 15 nationalities, from such diverse places as Russia, Eritrea, and <a href="Papua New Guinea. In March I was in Albania where I started a course to prepare Albanian Christians for missions. In February I worked with an Indonesian Bible translation organization on a training course for Indonesians doing Bible Storying projects, and also gave some training to teachers at an Indonesian language school.

"Another thing I do is to present on-field workshops for language coaches and teachers. Language coaches are people who help missionaries learn languages, or who supervise their learning. Our Language Coach Workshops were given in Thailand and in Hungary this year, to allow people from different parts of the world to attend. This year's workshops were packed out!

Sometimes I'm asked by people from another mission to come and give them on-field training or consultation. In July I was invited to <u>Israel</u> to work with people learning modern Hebrew and Arabic. They wanted ideas about how to work with speakers of those languages, and how



to continue learning, after they finished language school. It was a thrill to be there and to help these learners.

One of the issues we've identified with the youth is an inability to have intellectual conversations about hot button topics. In high school there have always been difficult questions that arise in conversations. Steve has been covering these topics with the students in hopes of being able to teach them how to think and reason better about their faith. One topic is how do we approach other religions and their followers in a sensitive way. Discussing difficult topics at youth group is a place where students can both be informed and express themselves in a safe environment. Steve really loves it when students or leaders disagree with him. The leaders are eager to help the students grow and broaden their knowledge, so they will be better equipped to answer difficult questions that may come up at school or around friends.

Please consider joining our dynamic group. Also, we are strongly considering meeting on a new night for youth group. Starting in January we may be meeting on Wednesday nights. Children's Christian Education

Our Preschoolers, under Jessica Bayless, Marna Bayless, Susan Murphy, and Joan Brown, have been learning about Abraham and Sarah and how they obeyed God. Before that? The Creation story, and Noah and the flood. Late November brought us stories of Joseph and Samuel, then in December the birth of Jesus, helping them prepare for "A Simple Christmas Pageant" during our Dec. 18 worship service. This pageant has parts for all ages—We need many children, youth, and adults to participate. Costumes are being assembled and parts are being assigned now.

Elementary school children completed learning about Daniel in early November, under Lois Harmon's leadership. We hope that making puppets and using them to act out Daniel and his friends' experiences will help the students remember how those young men loved God and faithfully prayed to him. Later in November, Doris Metzger led the children in Jesus' parable of the talents. The children found the story in the New Testament, where we noticed the timing of this parable—just one week before Jesus' death—and his reasons for telling the story to his disciples. We talked about the emphasis on faithfulness that the master commendad. Next we plan to think about the gifts God gives to us and how we can use them in ways that would please him.

Janet Stahl is leading our **Junior High** students during November and December. Janet comments, "This month our topic...has been being thankful. Do you know the biblical example of the worst case of thankfulness? Look at Jesus' parable of the two men praying in the Temple After talking about Jesus' warning against a wrong attitude of thankfulness, we looked through Psalm 100 and talked about what we can do to be thankful and to "enter God's gates" wherever we are. We took time to write poems of thankfulness. **We encourage you to read the poems on the bulletin board outside the church office.** And join us in thanking God for the junior high students he is bringing to our church.

Christian Education (Expect the unexpected from our youth!)


Usher (We can always use one or two more folks.)
