Open Doors – Opportunities Provided by God

Our monthly session meetings are divided into two equal parts – half of each meeting devoted to spiritual leadership and the other half devoted to the work or business of the church here in Duncanville. At our October session meeting just last week, Pastor Ginger presented us with a book we will study for the next several months entitled "All the Places to Go, How Will You Know", by The Rev. Dr. John Ortberg, Senior Pastor of Menlo Park Presbyterian Church, Menlo Park, CA. For this first meeting, without having an opportunity to study or review beforehand, we perused through the first chapter hitting the highlights, so to speak. We'll do more in-depth study as we go along, but this first chapter opened the door for me to have something to pass along to you, something that's right in front of each one of us every day.

A research study has found that the average person makes about seventy conscious decisions every day. That's about 25,500 decisions a year and, to someone over seventy, that 1,788,500 decisions in a lifetime. Now we all know that the majority of these decisions aren't major, life-changing decisions but just a part of everyday living. But interspersed between all of these ordinary decisions are open doors that are opportunities provided by God. We don't know what's on the other side; we don't know if all will be pleasant and smooth. There's only one way to find out and that's to take the risk and go through the door. What makes it even more

difficult is that God doesn't tell us which door to choose. We have to take the risk. You heard Steve Netniss speak on Sunday about taking risk.

For many of us, we might think, we'll, I've already made all those decisions and taken all the risk I'm going to take at this point in my life. But that's not true. Even though we no longer need to make those major decisions about what school we should attend or what career we should pursue, which job we should take or where we should live, there are still opportunities or open doors that God is putting in front of us every day. Dr. Ortberg points out that an open door is an opportunity provided by God, to act with God and for God. Our lives are filled with doors, and even for those of us who are now retired, he points out that the word retire isn't in the Bible. What does God have for us next?

Some of us will recall these words from Dr. Seuss, which Dr. Ortberg quotes in his book:

"You have brains in your head. You have feet in your shoes. You can steer yourself any direction you choose.....

Oh, the places you'll go!

Except when you don't. Because, sometimes, you won't."

What could you be doing right this moment that you aren't doing? "Oh, the places you'll go!!"

Cook's Corner

With the holidays quickly approaching, here's a couple of recipes to keep handy while you're planning the grand menu. Shared with us from Doris Metzger.

Eggnog Bavarian

3/4 c. cold water
3 (1 TBS.) envelopes unflavored gelatin
4 cups dairy eggnog (1 Qt.)

1/4 c. sugar 1/4 tsp. nutmeg 1 c. whipping cream, whipped

Sprinkle gelatin on water to soften. In a 2 qt. saucepan, place 1 cup eggnog, sugar, nutmeg and softened gelatin. Heat over low heat, stirring occasionally, until gelatin is dissolved. Add remaining 3 cups eggnog and chill until thickened. Fold in Whipped cream and turn into a 7-cup mold. Chill until firm. Unmold and serve with cranberry or Cran-Apple sauce (see recipe below), if desired. Serves 12. (A few drops red or green food coloring can be added to the mixture with the last 3 cups eggnog to tint.)

Cran-Apple Sauce

3/4 c. sugar 1/2 c. water 1 cup cranberries 1/4 cup water 1/2 tsp. unflavored gelatin 1 cup chopped apples 1.3 cup chopped nuts

In a 1 ½ qt. saucepan, combine sugar and ½ cup water. Add cranberries and boil 5 minutes. Meanwhile, soften gelatin in ¼ cup water; add to cranberry mixture and stir until dissolved. Remove from heat; stir in apple and nuts. Cool. Serve with eggnog Bavarian. Makes 2 cups.


