### From Pastor Ginger Hertenstein

Why God? Often you hear conversation surrounding that question. It might be "Why, God?" as if asking why did this or that happen; perhaps in response to that common, unanswered query regarding an adverse circumstance. Or, it might be "Why God?" as in why should I think about the need for God? The season of Advent poses this question to us, and as we ponder its answer, hopefully each of us can respond with a well-reasoned argument about "Why God!" that is, "Here's why I believe God is valuable and vital to the good life."

Advent, by its definition means coming, arrival, official visit. In ancient Greek culture parousia of a ruler meant preparing flattering speeches, improving the streets, golden wreaths, giving money, making magnificent. As Christians waiting for our King, we know we are to do exactly the same. Are you prepared?

### Mission News

An Update from Paul and Jennifer Schaefer

Dear friends,

Since we returned to Ghana we seen two major advances: setting up a Safaliba reading program for public schools in Mandari, and the recording of gospel songs in the traditional Safaliba musical styles. Along with this, work on Bible translation and Safaliba literacy classes continues.

God arranged a meeting with an American professor of Bilingual Education who had worked in Ghana. He came to Mandari to meet with the teachers in the Mandari schools and we did some example lessons in the classrooms using Safaliba to teach reading. The teachers became convinced that Safaliba would benefit the children.

Such a reading program requires materials and training, so Paul has been working with Eden and others to create a set of child-oriented reading books which the teachers use to teach 1st graders how to read and write Safaliba. The book for the first school term has been completed, and printed. Please pray as Paul meets with the teachers to introduce the book, plan for its use and for the success of this literacy effort. If all Safaliba children actually learn to read Safaliba in school, then not only will they do better in learning English and going further in their education, but they will also be able to read the translated Scriptures.

Another major milestone has been the performance and recording of songs based on the scriptures, sung in the traditional Safaliba music style and performed with their traditional horns and drums. One of the barriers to evangelization of the Safaliba people has been that the churches rarely use traditional music styles and never use traditional instruments, creating the impression that Christianity is only for those who are ready to learn a foreign style of music. Music has a powerful effect, and when people realize that they can worship God with their own music it can almost be as revolutionary as worshiping in their own language.

Again God brought together key people for this project. A young pastor, David, was urged by one of the older Safaliba Christians to write songs using the traditional style. But the results still sounded foreign. Then Eden and David listened to a cassette of scripture songs which had been recorded for a neighboring language group many years ago. Paul asked Eden to play the music for Eden's father (a village elder and renowned singer in the traditional style as well as the chief drummer of Mandari). He also explained that we would like to use the Safaliba Scriptures to compose songs using their traditional music style and instruments.

About a week later, unexpectedly, the group (mostly older Safaliba men) said we should come and hear a rehearsal. It was amazing. There were about 10 people, playing horns (real antelope's horns), drums and other percussion instruments. Eden's father started singing a song about Jesus. These older men were not Christian, but the music was beautiful and a small crowd gathered to enjoy it. Eden then went through some scriptures that we had translated. A couple of weeks later at the recording studio at the Wycliffe office in Tamale we recorded an hour of Safaliba Christian music. On the day of recording we had the opportunity to talk with these older Safaliba musicians about Jesus and what it means to be a Christian. It was the first time these older people have been able to ask questions about Christianity and realize that it is not all about foreign music and customs. Since we returned to Mandari these men have continued to meet and are eager to continue to compose songs based on the Scriptures.

Paul has now edited the sound recordings and set them up to be played on the Saber Audio Players used for playing recorded scriptures. The songs can also be stored and played on many of the mobile phones that people have. Please pray that these songs would draw people to God.

Thank you for all your prayers and encouragement. Just as each member of the body is needed for the building up of the body, so this translation task is a group, joint effort. Thank you for your part in all of this!

#### Cook's Corner

This month, Edelmira Ruiz shares with us her delicious recipe for Colombian Chicken Pie. The Ruiz's love this dish and it is a Sunday favorite. Enjoy!

#### Colombian Chicken Pie

This recipe is for 12 persons but you can make in half.

4 chicken breasts

6 cups mozzarella cheese grated

10 small eggs or 8 large eggs

1 tsp of capers

1 cup of peppers,  $\frac{1}{2}$  red and  $\frac{1}{2}$  green

 $\frac{1}{2}$  stalk of celery

1 cup of chopped mushrooms

Garlic, thyme, bay leaves, salt and pepper to taste.

Cook chicken breasts with the spices in 4 cups of water, remove the chicken from the water where it cooked and set apart. Save the remaining water.

When the chicken is cool you start to shred it in small pieces. Then in a bowl beat the eggs, add the mozzarella cheese, the peppers, the shredded breasts, capers chopped, the celery.

Strained the broth where the chicken was cooked and take 1 cup and dissolve 2 tablespoons of flour. Mix everything well and then put it in a large pyrex baking dish.

Preheat the oven 350 F. Bake the pie covered with aluminum foil for 20 minutes, then remove the foil and bake it for other 25 minutes until is done and golden.

I baked and leave it overnight, the next day I warm it and it tastes better.

Childcare is available during the performance, and refreshments will be served afterwards in the Fellowship Hall.




### PW Women
