From our Pastor

As we study Mark we remember Mark's thesis for his gospel: *The Beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.* Mark attempts to prove that statement. Each week's message during worship will have some element to support it. So let's review.

The good news begins with the coming of Jesus, the Messiah. Mark proclaimed the good news that Jesus, not Caesar, rules. That declaration would have hit Mark's readers hard, because it seemed that they were always under the thumb of the Roman government. Today, we can count on Jesus' "rule," too. Even though we may be uncertain about our own rulers in this election year, and we might be concerned about the direction of the PC(USA), for us Jesus rules, and we can depend on His truth. Jesus' truth offers a great deal of security in uncertain times when we let our lives be defined by Him.

Mark talks about a community of love between the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, and we are invited into that circle of love. That means faith is built in relationships. In other words, God is not a principle but a Real Being we love and get to know. Are you getting to know Him?

What do you believe about Jesus? Mark shows people's response to Jesus. He pushes us for a decision, too. It is the most important decision in the world, and will shape your life. The Bible helps you to make it, and so does worship, fellowship, and prayer. Practice these things.

With each chapter Mark challenges us to really question. And at the same time he tells us up front: this news is really good; very good. This news brings us lasting joy. Do you believe that a love relationship with God is possible? I hope so! And I hope it leads you to center your life in God.



Words from Worship

Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, is February 22* this year. It's worth repeating Ginger's words to us in our March, 2011 newsletter as we approached Lent

last year:



Our spiritual nurture is facilitated and enriched when we undertake some of it together. We have the opportunity to do that in our **Ash Wednesday service**, **7:00-7:45 p.m.**

*Lent follows the "40 days and 40 nights" pattern of Jesus' temptation by Satan that we focused on together at our January 22 service. Ash Wednesday is more than 40 days before Easter Sunday because the Sundays during Lent don't count toward the 40 days—our worshiping together on Sundays reflects the joy and celebration of Jesus' coming back to life on Easter Sunday, rather than the more somber tone of reflection and repentance that is the focus of Lent.

I Give Up! Many Christians use Lent as a time to take some specific action to get their life more in tune with God's values. Some actions are negative, like giving up something during Lent (whether doughnuts, video games, sleeping in on Sunday mornings,...). Others are positive, like serving a few hours every week in a community or church project. Others are both, like giving up a daily stop at Starbucks and giving the money to a worthy cause instead. These actions can be done for wrong reasons, of course, like anything else. But done out of love for God and a desire to keep Him in first place above all other things in life clamoring to be "gods", they can bring joy and growth in "becoming by grace what God is by nature" (as Athanasius put it). See 2 Peter 1:4, "...so that...you may become partakers of the divine nature,...".

Missions News ~ From the Walters family

In 1994 FPCD sent us out (Dennis and Susan) to work in East Asia. And now in 2012, you are still encouraging us.

The past two and a half years, we've needed to be back in the US. Our family has so enjoyed being with you all at FPCD. Our kids have loved your friendship, your support of their activities, and your fun at the talent shows. We (Dennis and Susan) have appreciated seeking out God together in Sunday School, reverent moments of corporate worship with you, and your helping hands as we furnished a house, and travelled in and out. Thank you for welcoming us and walking alongside us.



Now we are thinking of our return to East Asia this summer. While we are daunted by a few challenges, like our kids' continued schooling, we are eager and happy to go back. There is a lot going on there in "Zeeland". Just this week we received word that, In the last two months there were verified reports of 100 people turning to Christ just by listening to a Christian radio broadcast in the Zee language. Later a Zee man took at least 40 of them to the nearby hot springs to be baptized. The next time they visited, the converts were numbering around 200.

As part of getting ready to move back to "Zeeland", Dennis and Susan will head over to Asia for two weeks. We will be gone Jan 15-30. There are several things we hope to do:

- 1. Discuss with some experts the details of a Zee language survey
- 2. Learn to integrate our data into the company's data archives
- 3. Pray with our colleagues
- 4. Talk to moms who have home schooled their high schoolers in Asia

While we travel this time our kids will stay in Duncanville. Some of you are helping us make the trip by teaching Andrew Gary while we are away.

Thank you for supporting us so that we can help new brothers and sisters on the other side of the world--people you haven't met yet, but who are your family too.

December Spaghetti Supper's Impact

The Spaghetti Supper hosted by Presbyterian Women this past December was a happy evening. We enjoyed the good dinner and had a good time bidding at the Auction. (Special thanks to everyone who contributed items.) After expenses, proceeds from the auction were about \$1100, of which \$500 was given to help buy a new refrigerator for the church kitchen, \$100 went toward PW National's Mission fund, and \$500 will be sent to support Home of Hope, in Harare, Zimbabwe, in eastern Africa, which has been the 2011 mission emphasis of our church's Presbyterian Women.

Home of Hope is one of the projects sponsored by the Outreach Foundation (of the Presbyterian Church). We suggest that you go to their website theoutreachfoundation.org to read about the work of Presbyterians all around the world. There you will see a recent posting from the Home of Hope, which includes these comments:

"We continue to be in awe of how faithful God has been with the needs of this ministry.....We have helped about 50 children get into school for the final term. The priority, as always, was the children of the mothers who come for train who are in need......There are presently 25 mothers being trained in dress-making skills by Lucy. Our favorite time wi praise and worship and a meal...

"Our food for the homeless program is still offered for about 60 people, mostly men, every Monday through Friday at 7 and tea served daily and a bar of soap given out every two weeks. Medicines are also distributed, as well as money to hospital for more serious cases."

Our 2012 Mission Project

This year we will support the work of the <u>Sureste Theological Seminary in the state of Tabasco in Mexico</u> (see http://www.theoutreachfoundation.org/index.php?option=com_k2&view=item&id=212:sureste-presbyterian-theological-seminary). On the Outreach Foundation's website you can find a letter from someone who was there in December. He writes of visiting the seminary and churches which he reports are growing. "The seminary is truly having a large impact on the churches in Tabasco."


