From our Pastor

About that meeting in Orlando . . .

At our recent congregational meeting a request was made for more communication about the new movement which has been initiated in the past year. I am happy to do so! Two national meetings have taken place, one in Minneapolis last August, and a second one in Orlando in January 2012. Two options have come out of these gatherings. One is a new movement. Called Evangelical Covenant Order of Presbyterians, or ECO, it has been formed and incorporated as a separate order from the PC(USA), and churches that join ECO will move out of the PC(USA). It is not being called a denomination as such, but it will function in the same way as a denomination, with some significant differences. Each church will own its own property. Churches' leaders will be connected through a covenant of grace to foster growth and accountability in discipleship. ECO has set up an insurance and pension structure and written a constitution, including polity and confessions.

The second option is to join the association called the New Fellowship of Presbyterians. Churches that join the New Fellowship remain members of the PC(USA), but the association will allow them to be identified with a group of churches within the PC (USA) who are unified by commitment to a particular set of values as established by the Fellowship. If you would like to read the covenant, you may go to: http://www.fellowship-pres.org/about/ Membership in this affiliation costs \$250 per year for a congregation, and that allows the church to participate in the annual conference of ECO, gives access to pastoral support and development, and supplies resources to promote flourishing churches that make disciples of Jesus Christ.

Your session has been in prayerful consideration about these options. In the meantime, important ministry is happening at FPCD. Who are you inviting to come along with you? The season of Lent offers nourishment for the soul through worship,

prayer, Bible study, music, and fellowship. I hope you will bring your friends so you can introduce them to the most endearing and important Lord we can ever meet. Can't wait to experience it all together!

From the Schaefers

Paul and Jennifer send greetings from Ghana. This Christmas they were able to give to their Safaliba people the recently translated and checked story of the birth of Christ from Luke. Their letter included the translation of the text; all the linguists among us can probably even read it with the proper pronunciation. Take a moment and imagine what it would be like to read that story for the very first time.*

From the Benitezes

Carlos and Caryn report that all is well there in Niger. Their colleagues 'A' and 'H' have almost finished the first draft of Exodus and have started on drafts of the narrative portions of the rest of the Pentateuch. The next step is to test the text with more mother-tongue speakers to make sure it is well understood.

A workshop on translation principles held last month was a great help to their team. Now 'H' has software on his computer so that he can work on translation; in the past he worked only on "back translation" (a literal translation from his own language back into French, so visiting consultants can understand how the Bible passage was trans-

lated into his language). Having two translators working at the same time on different passages moves the work along faster. Please pray that both will learn the orthography (the spelling) of their language quickly and that they will work well together as a team.

The first half of 2012 Carol's team leader 'M' is hoping to study outside the country. If this goes



through Carlos will need to supervise that language program and his translator 'B' as well. He asked for prayer that they will be able to work out all the details so that 'M' would be able to study and the translation will go forward while he is gone.

The Benitez children are thoroughly enjoying school and doing well academically. Children in the school they attend do not always come from Christian families; the Benitezes are concerned and prayerful that their children be able to choose friends of good character and be a good influence on those they have.

Finally they asked for your prayer as they make a major decision about their coming back to the US sometime next summer. First it concerns the amount of time it should be – six months or a year. The timing also impacts the timing of their son's schooling in Niger. Either option has advantages or disadvantages. Please pray for wisdom to make the best decision for the continuation of the work and the good of the family.

Both these families are very thankful for our part in their translation team.

What's Up in Kids' Sunday School?

Take a look at the bulletin board near the church office door and you will see art work showing some of what various groups of kids have been learning recently in Sunday School!

Students in the Elementary Grades have been hearing and acting out stories of Jesus' early life—his dedication as a tiny baby at the temple in Jerusalem, his family's trip to Egypt, their return to Nazareth, their special visit to the temple in Jerusalem when Jesus was twelve, and finally his baptism at the River Jordan. The students have been asked to relate these events to places where they happened. Posted on the bulletin board are colorful paintings students made of what Jesus and those around saw and heard at his baptism.

Jr. High's have been learning about talking to God, listening to Him, worshiping Him, and being like Him (see bulletin board for creative art on not conforming to the pattern of this world). Now we're looking at what the Bible teaches us about how to love each other as Christ has loved us.

Our Sr. High's have been continuing their journey through the book of James where we explore what is happening to the 1st century community James is writing to. We look at each verse and ask questions about whether or not the message is legitimate and if we understand it. Some of the students continue to push the envelope with difficult questions which cause us to sometimes go off track. But the book of James is still a great practical handbook for daily life for Christians young and old.
