One of the families of our church works in Asia; their son started his college work this year at the Coast Guard Academy. His recent letters tell about a project in which some of the cadets are involved; we can help as well. Read on:

The Vision: On December 14, Dale wrote:

Dear Friends,

As most of you know, I am currently in my first year of studies at the Coast Guard Academy. I'm learning a lot and have found Christian fellowship on campus. Over my spring break this year, I'm planning to go on a mission trip to Haiti with a group of 15 other cadets. On this trip, we will be working with an organization called A Door To Hope. Their ministries include helping at an orphanage, praying with believers and building houses in the coastal town of Grand Goave. I think that participating in this mission trip will be a growing experience for me by exposing me to an area of the world that I haven't experienced, as well as giving me an opportunity to serve people who really need it. The cost for us to travel there and get room and board during the trip comes out to \$800 per person. Since we are not sponsored by any group, we are relying on donations to pay for the trip. In order to spread the cost evenly, we are pooling donations together. Any financial support is a blessing and will lighten the burden for each member of the team going. Whether or not you are able to give financially, we also need prayer for the people of Haiti, for the local organization and for our team.

The Provision: On January 20, this letter arrived.


Friends and Family,
