

The Season of Lent

From the Worship Team

The season of Lent has not been well observed in much of evangelical Christianity, largely because it was associated with "high church" liturgical worship that some churches were eager to reject. However, much of the background of evangelical Christianity, for example the heritage of John Wesley, was very "high church." Many of the churches that had originally rejected more formal and deliberate liturgy are now recovering aspects of a larger Christian tradition as a means to refocus on spirituality in a culture that is increasingly secular.

Originating in the fourth century of the church, the season of Lent spans 40 weekdays beginning on Ash Wednesday and climaxing during Holy Week with Holy Thursday (Maundy Thursday), Good Friday, and concluding Saturday before Easter. Originally, Lent was the time of preparation for those who were to be baptized, a time of concentrated study and prayer before their baptism at the Easter Vigil, the celebration of the Resurrection of the Lord early on Easter Sunday. But since these new members were to be received into a living community of Faith, the entire community was called to preparation. Also, this was the time when those who had been separated from the Church would prepare to rejoin the community.



Today, Lent is marked by a time of prayer and preparation to celebrate Easter. Since Sundays celebrate the resurrection of Jesus, the six Sundays that occur during Lent are not counted as part of the 40 days of Lent, and are referred to as the Sundays **in** Lent. The number 40 is connected with many biblical events, but especially with the forty days Jesus spent in the wilderness preparing for His ministry by facing the temptations that could lead him to abandon his mission and calling. Christians today use this period of time for introspection, self examination, and repentance. This season of the year is equal only to the Season of Advent in importance in the Christian year, and is part of the second major grouping of Christian festivals and sacred time that includes Holy Week, Easter, and Pentecost.

Lent has traditionally been marked by penitential prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Some churches today still observe a rigid schedule of fasting on certain days during Lent, especially the giving up of meat, alcohol, sweets, and other types of food. Other traditions do not place as great an emphasis on fasting, but focus on charitable deeds, especially helping those in physical need with food and clothing, or simply the giving of money to charities. Most Christian churches that observe Lent at all focus on it as a time of prayer, especially penance, repenting for failures and sin as a way to focus on the need for God's grace. It is really a preparation to celebrate God's marvelous redemption at Easter, and the resurrected life that we live, and hope for, as Christians.

April 9 — Maundy Thursday

FPCD will have a Maundy Thursday Service with communion & a Cantata starting at 7:00 pm. The Choir will present a special cantata unique in concept, soaring in spirit, and with music, text, and narration by Pepper Choplin. *Come Touch the Robe* allows us to encounter Jesus Christ Lord of healing, glory, authority, humility, and victory. This work uses the simple garment that Jesus wore as a thematic device to recount the interaction of those who were with Him during His last days on Earth. To a suffering woman, His robe conveyed divine healing. On the mountaintop, the robe shone and filled the disciples' eyes with His glory and authority. When Jesus laid His garment aside in the upper room, it displayed His humility as a servant. At the tomb, the grave clothes He left behind help us experience His resurrection and the victory over death. It is through these personal, touching moments that our hearts are fully prepared to meet Jesus in an intimate way, allowing us to experience the healing, the glory, and the power of Christ, and rejoice in the stirring celebration of the resurrection of the Lamb of God.

April 10 — Good Friday

FPCD will be having a Prayer Vigil in the Sanctuary from 6:00 am to 12:00 am. There will be a sign-up sheet in the Narthex with 30 minute time slots. Hymnals, Bibles, books for Meditation, CD's & a CD player will be provided. Feel free to bring your own Bible, books or inspirational music.

April 12 — Easter

FPCD will have a Easter Sunrise service (pancake breakfast) & a 10:30 am Worship Service. The Easter Sunrise service will be lead by the Youth. Easter lilies will be available to purchase in honor or memory of someone.


On both sides of the sign the word Church was misspelled. It said "First Presbyterian Chruch".

Duncanville's Mr. Music



Steve Bayless' talent and experience in music are as large as the instruments he plays. And they are among the largest in the orchestra—the tuba and the bass violin. He is equally as comfortable at the conductor's stand and the composer's desk.

For the past 14 years Steve has served as Minister of Music at First Presbyterian Church of Duncanville. He enjoys working closely with Rev. Ginger Hertenstein so that the music used in worship supports the message of the service. His desire is "to tie it all together—musically and scripturally." Sometimes this involves composing a special arrangement for use by the choir. Steve's extensive musical experience enables him to draw on many styles to fit the occasion—traditional hymns and choral anthems, or contemporary gospel songs and spirituals. He has also spearheaded a number of musical presentations at the church, some with accompanying string orchestras. On the 4th of July he organized and lead a Dixieland band on the lawn of the church to entertain Duncanville residents who gathered there to watch the city's fireworks.

Steve is a long time resident of southwest Dallas County. His family moved to Oak Cliff when he was in high school, for his father was pastor of Oak Cliff Presbyterian Church. His aptitude and love for music showed up as a child. He absorbed the music of the church as the son of a pastor. He learned to pick out chords and melodies on a family Autoharp and listened avidly to a variety of records on a Victrola. Steve stated that by the time he was in first grade he had a good repertoire of different styles of music and tunes.

After completing a music major at UNT, he returned to the Oak Cliff area to teach. In his first job he began bands in six elementary schools there, teaching the students to play the needed instruments. At the time music teachers were paid by the number of pupils they instructed; Steve's accomplishment surprised many. He then became Assistant Band Director and Orchestra Director at Kimball High School. From there he went on to teach at Dallas Baptist University, East Texas University and Mt. View College.

Directing choirs has also been a part of Steve's interest. He began at his father's church, then served at First Presbyterian of Dallas and Rosemont Christian Church before coming to First Presbyterian Church of Duncanville. Outside of church Steve lends his musical support to the Silver Serenaders, a singing group of seniors that is well known in the area.

In 1974 Steve and his wife Marna established their own music production company that has produced a variety of projects from German bands, a Fife and Drum Corps complete with costumes and 3-corner hats to an 18 piece orchestra that plays dinner music, to conventions, to fund raisers with Julie Andrews and Clinton Eastwood for the Dallas Center for the Performing Arts. In the summer of 2007, Steve composed the music for the opening session of the Rotary International Convention at Salt Lake City. The International Children's Choir sang his music at the event. As a member of the Oak Cliff Lion's Club, Steve works on their musical variety show for their annual fundraiser. It's no wonder that some of his music projects become all night events more often than not.

MOVIE NIGHT AT THE FPCD CINEMA




