Are We Caterpillars or Butterflies?

I recently received a copy of the book *Forgotten God: Reversing our Tragic Neglect of the Holy Spirit* by Frances Chan. I want to share with you some thoughts I felt were interesting. As most know, the Holy Spirit is the part of our three-part God that dwells within us.

The author states his concern of a trend he saw begin in the 1980's. At this time many churches began to emphasize entertainment in the worship service. Their success is measured by the growth in attendance. He feels a better measure of a church's success is how spirit-filled the congregation is. A church needs a way to change people from an audience into active Christians filled with the Holy Spirit.

The reason some people do not have the Holy Spirit in their life is fear. Some fear that if they ask Him to come in He might not come. This can come from a feeling of unworthiness or be caused by past disappointments. The result is a life lived on the edge of Christianity and instead of its fullness. The Bible tells us we only have to ask and he will come into our life. Others fear that if they ask the Holy Spirit to come in He will. Most of us like to feel we are in control of our lives. If we ask Him and He comes in we won't have control anymore. He may direct us to change our job, to move, or to take on a role that we don't feel qualified to do. Doesn't that sound scary? Too many decide to ask God to be a part of their life not the center of their life. Again this leads to people being on the edge of Christianity.

Our pastor frequently tells us that we go nowhere by accident. Mr. Chan says when we are called somewhere it is not so we can settle in, get comfortable, and live our life in peace. He sent us there to do a job.

Speaking of being comfortable, the author says we are usually closest to God when we are uncomfortable. He gave an example of a group of South Korean missionaries who were captured by the Taliban. A few were killed but most were finally released after a period of time in harsh conditions. Later some of them said that sometimes they have wished they were back in captivity because that was when they were closest to God.

Mr. Chan says he sometimes wonders what a caterpillar thinks. He is living his life as a fat worm crawling on the ground. One day he takes a nap. When he wakes up, he has a small body, beautiful wings, and can fly. The author says this is how we should feel when we turn our life over to the Holy Spirit. Do you want to be a caterpillar or a butterfly?


Sunday, our Maundy Thursday focus on Jesus' last conversation with his followers,


