Sometimes you come across a story that has a special meaning or tugs at your heart. Here is one concerning angels:

Angel on the Highway (author unknown)

I just had one of the most amazing experiences of my life, and wanted to share it with my family and friends. Here it is:

I was driving home from a meeting this evening about five, stuck in traffic on Colorado Boulevard, and my car started to choke and sputter and died.

I barely managed to coast, cruising, into a gas station, glad only that I would not be blocking traffic and would have a somewhat warm spot to wait for the tow truck. It wouldn't even turn over. Before I could make the call, I saw a woman walk out of the "quickie mart" building, and it looked like she slipped on some ice and fell into a gas pump! So I got out to see if she was okay. When I got there, it looked more like she had been overcome by sobs than that she had fallen. She was a young woman who looked really haggard with dark circles under her eyes. She dropped something as I helped her up, and I picked it up to give it to her. It was a nickel.

At that moment, everything came into focus for me: the crying woman, the ancient Suburban crammed full of stuff with three kids in the back (one in a car seat), and the gas pump reading \$4.95. I asked her if she was okay and if she needed help, and she just kept saying "I don't want my kids to see my crying," so we stood on the other side of the pump from her car. She said she was driving to California and that things were very hard for her right now.

So, I asked, "and you were praying?" That made her back away from me a little, but I assured her I was not a crazy person and said, "He heard you, and He sent me."

I took out my card and swiped it through the card reader on the pump so she could fill up her car completely, and while it was fueling walked to the next door McDonald's and bought two big bags of food, some gift certificates for more, and a big cup of coffee. She gave the food to the kids in the car who attacked it like wolves, and we stood by the pump eating fries and talking a little.

She told me her name, and that she lived in Kansas City. Her boyfriend left two months ago and she had not been able to make ends meet. She knew she wouldn't have money to pay the rent January 1st, and finally, in desperation, had called her parents, with whom she had not spoken in about five years. They lived in California and said she could come live with them and try to get on her feet there.

So she packed up everything she owned in the car. She told the kids they were going to California for Christmas, but not that they were going to live there.

I gave her my gloves, a little hug and said a quick prayer with her for safety on the road. As I was walking over to my car, she said, "So, are you like an angel or something?"

This definitely made me cry. I said, "Sweetie, at this time of year angels are really busy, so sometimes God uses regular people."

It was so incredible to be a part of someone else's miracle. And, of course, you guessed it, when I got in my car it started right away and got me home with no problem. I'll put it in the shop tomorrow for a check, but I suspect the mechanic won't find anything wrong.

Sometimes the angels fly close enough to you that you can hear the flutter of their wings.

"Cast thy burden upon the Lord, and He shall sustain thee. He shall never suffer the righteous to be moved." – Psalms 55:22.

For the past year, we know where there are a lot of angels masquerading as regular folks. They can be found at FPCD. They are in Sunday school classrooms, in the choir, in the sound room and the office. They are in the congregation everywhere. They send cards, they make special gifts, they plan surprise parties, they provide encouragement and smiling faces and many, many prayers! God has truly blessed us with these angels!

Mission News

Hi Friends,

We received an update from Mimi and Abang, the coaches for the Esther storytelling project, this morning that may have the most compelling evidence that Bible storytelling is an effective strategy for reaching all kinds of people. They visited one of the Esther storytellers in her home area this week. And as they usually do, they went with the storyteller to visit the various groups that she meets with regularly. In the morning they went to one village where 50 people of the lowest segment of society, 'the untouchables,' gathered to hear the Bible stories. Three women from the group shared stories that day, which is evidence that the Esther storytelling is passing on what she is learning. One of those three women shared her vision for telling the Bible stories to everyone in their village so that the whole village might believe in Jesus.

Immediately afterward, Mimi and Abang went with the Esther storyteller to her next group in a different village where 10 people were gathered. They found out that most of the group was missing that day because of a wedding. These people are all members of the highest status in their society and are generally more wealthy and able to afford education. Even this group of people have come to faith in Jesus through the storytelling.

Mimi and Abang typically ask the members of these groups two questions and often the answers are similar. Here is what they reported from this trip regarding the questions:

1. And we ask what did you learn from the stories in your life? They said that by hearing and learning Bible stories we got healed of our sickness and got peace in our family and also in our life.

2. Again we ask after hearing and learning Bible story, what did you do? And they said we are sharing to others what God has done in our life and also told them Bible stories and the love of God.

Thank you all so much for praying for the Esther project.

Cook's Corner

Sausage and Egg Casserole From Kathleen Ryan Hartless

6 eggs

Mix these three ingredients together in a bowl.

- 2 cups milk
- 1 tsp. salt
- -----

1 pound sausage---cook and drain. Mix with 1 tsp. dry mustard

3 slices bread—tear into pieces

- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 1 can mushrooms

Mix last two parts. Pour liquid mixture (eggs, milk, and salt) over dry mixture. Refrigerate overnight. Bake uncovered at 350 degrees for 45 -60 minutes making sure that the eggs are fully cooked and not soupy. When doubling the recipe, use 1-pound plain and 1 pound hot sausage.
