Pastor's Message for May

During Holy Week we experienced phenomenal worship and connection with God through our Lenten study series, Palm Sunday, the Maundy Thursday cantata, *The Living Last Supper*, the Good Friday prayer vigil, and two Easter services. So many of you participated in these events, whether it was to attend the study series, take a prayer slot, or sing in the choir, or as one of the disciples or Jesus, or work the media center, or lead the children's bells, or serve on Movie Night, or plan and advertise our events. We worshipped well, and wasn't it great to see almost every seat filled in the sanctuary on Maundy Thursday? That means you reached out and the community responded.

The weeks' experiences truly led many to worship, and each time I now drive by and see the new plaque above the cross, the words in Hebrew, Latin, and Greek, *Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews*, make me think of Jesus' impact on FPCD this season. Jesus makes a huge difference in every life, no matter what our circumstances.

Then, a week after Easter, I entered the parking lot early Monday morning and saw three familiar cars belonging to three ladies of the church. A smile crossed my face. And, one gift has led to another, with three turning into five and five turning into more and more people becoming involved to restore and renew God's house.

WORDS FROM WORSHIP

SYMBOLS of our faith...Symbols of the Twelve Apostles

Words from Worship

The twelve Apostles chosen by Jesus to be His special representatives were "*Peter, James the son of Zebedee, John the brother of James, Andrew, Philip, Bartholomew, Mat-thew, Thomas, James the son of Alphaeus, Thaddaeus, Simon the Canaanite, and Judas Iscariot.*" Mark 3:16 The scriptures inform us that James was the first of the disciples to die a martyr's death, and indeed the only one whose manner of death is exactly known. Acts 12:2 informs us that James was martyred for the faith by way of a sword.



Philip may have been a disciple of John the Baptist and is mentioned as one of the Apostles in the lists of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and in Acts. Aside from the lists, he is mentioned only in John in the New Testament. He was called by Jesus Himself and brought Nathanael to Christ. Philip was present at the miracle of the loaves and fishes, when he engaged in a brief dialogue with the Lord, and was the Apostle approached by the Hellenistic Jews from Bethsaida to introduce them to Jesus. Just before the Passion, Jesus answered Philip's query to show them the Father.

The symbol of Philip is a basket, because of his part in the feeding of the five thousand. It is he that stressed the cross as a sign of Christianity and victory.

Pentecost, The Church's Birthday

After the Resurrection, the risen Lord instructed his followers not to leave Jerusalem. It was there, Jesus said, that they would receive "the promise of the Father" (Acts 1:4). What was that promise? It was that they would be baptized not with water but with the Holy Spirit. Shortly after that utterance, Jesus was "lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight". On the first Pentecost after Jesus' resurrection, the Holy Spirit came upon Jesus' followers. Indeed, they were filled with power and love, thus empowering them to witness to God's actions in Christ to all who were nearby. Some 3,000 people responded to their claims that Jesus Christ was Lord and Savior of mankind. Pentecost was originally a Jewish harvest festival when the firstfruits of crops were given as offerings to God. The outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon Jesus' first followers on the day of Pentecost is often called the Church's birth-day.

Pentecost is celebrated this year on Sunday, May 23. The color for Pentecost is RED.



Property Report

Property Report

We received generous memorial gifts in honor of Dorothy Anderson from her family. After consultation with the family, these were applied to the purchase of new office furniture and new carpet for the CE wing. The new carpet will start at the double doors leading out of the Fellowship Hall, and cover the entire remainder of the building.





We decided to repaint the entire area. Most of it had not been painted for a long time, and we did not want to have to paint with the new carpet already installed. About half the painting was done by a PW crew: Joan Brown, Anna Murphy, Jocelyn Bolles, and Helen Barton, with occasional help from Paul. The remainder was done by a professional painter. At the same time, Marna Bayless and Lois Harmon have helped these ladies with cleaning and organizing the Sunday school classrooms.

PW is also paying for replacement of the double doors to the outside of the Fellowship Hall. That should be done before the end of April.

Many eave and other exterior woodwork problems are being corrected. Several gutters have been repaired or replaced, and new screens are being installed. We had to remove the large bushes along the courtyard to provide access for the screen and woodwork repairs. The bushes had actually caused some damage to the wood siding over the years which is being repaired as well.

The basketball goal was damaged beyond repair. It was removed by Bobby Reed.



After all that, there are still plenty of projects.

We need to replace the damaged accordion doors in Fellowship Hall, and install some kind of ground material on the playground to cushion falls and cover mud when it rains.

PW Mission emphasis for the coming year is helping to care for vulnerable children in Kamwenge, Uganda by donating funds for educational needs and school supplies.

Kamwenge Vocational School is a community school in the heart of rural Uganda with a vision to transform this poor community into a self-sustained and responsible one with a high sense of integrity and accountability in a Christian transforming environment.

The school is located on 20 acres of land in the district of Kamwenge, western Uganda. This area has a population of 300,000 people, mostly refugees from neighboring countries, and is considered one of the poorest in Uganda. Parents cannot afford to send their children to school and do not understand the importance of education. This illiteracy has increased the cycle of HIV/AIDS and poverty. The Kamwenge School aims to equip individuals with skills for sustainable socio-economic development, a holistic approach of building the Kingdom of God.

How You Can Help! Donations may be made toward this cause at our Circle Meetings through the year. We also designat a portion of our PW fundraisers toward this project. Our two PW fundraisers are the Spring Plant and Bake Sale and the PW Family Spaghetti Supper and Christmas Auction. We hope you will prayerfully consider joining with us to help these Ugandan families build a better life through education and hopefully to see the love of Jesus Christ through our generosity and concern.


