We recently received a letter from the Benitez family. Because not everyone sees the postings on the bulletin board in the CE foyer, I thought I'd give it a wider readership by reprinting it here. It's their recent news and gives us their requests for prayer. At the end are their mail and email addresses for your use. Let's support them in the coming months. –Doris Metzger

Dear Friends at First Pres.

In the news from West Africa you may be hearing of war, kidnappings, terrorism. The good news we hear from the field is that God's kingdom is advancing, Bible translation is progressing, and people are coming to Christ! Please continue to pray for the translation team on the field to remain faithful to the Lord and to the task He has given them to do.

Please pray for us, too, as the details concerning our return to the field are hazy. We need some clear guidance from the Lord. Even though the translation is progressing without us, we had planned to go back to Niger for one more year to support the translation efforts there, to tie up loose ends, and to enable our son to graduate from high school with his friends. However, we have recently had some doubts about whether this is the best course of action.

In any case, we are committed to the task of Bible translation for the long haul. According to the latest Wycliffe Global Alliance Scripture access statistics, 209 million people speaking 1,967 languages may have a need for Bible translation to begin. We had an active part in getting Bible translation started in two languages. YOU have had a part in this, too! Now we are looking at moving on, in order to facilitate translation in languages that as yet have no Scriptures.

Thank you for your gifts and for praying for us faithfully. We'd be happy to hear from you and will respond personally to any comments or questions you might have.
