

The disciples stood on a hill with the Lord and watched as He ascended into heaven. They gazed and gazed after Him, just as the children continued to look up to the ceiling of the sanctuary on Sunday as youth minister Tom Wylie let go of a helium-filled balloon to demonstrate the story. Finally two men in shining clothes jostled them back to reality. "Rest assured He'll come back in the same way He went," they said. "In the meantime you've got things to do." And the work of the church began.

Let's note how that work began. Acts 1:14 tells us, "All these (disciples) were constantly devoting themselves to prayer, together with certain women, including Mary the mother of Jesus, as well as his brothers." So the season between the resurrection and the start of the church, which is the day of Pentecost, was spent devoting themselves to prayer.

A woman named Martha Grace Reese has written a series of books about "unbinding" the Gospel. Essentially the books address the decline in the Presbyterian Church (USA) and what to do about it. Her belief is that we need to spend a season in prayer, allowing God to guide us into the expression of the Gospel through our God-given gifts. I love these books and think it's a great idea, entirely relevant for our congregation.

Let's take this month of May and join with the men and women who gathered in that upper room to pray. As we do so, we'll ponder Jesus' teachings in the parables of Luke, listening for His word to us, as we pray. I know He has something really special to say and that He will guide us. Let' listen together, assured of the blessing to come.

The Church Year: Pentecost

Pentecost was originally an Old Testament festival, since the time of Josephus calculated as beginning on the fiftieth day after the beginning of **Passover**. In the Christian calendar, it falls on the seventh Sunday after **Easter**. It was called the **Feast of Weeks** (*Shavuot*), and in the Old Testament was originally an agricultural festival celebrating and giving thanks for the "first fruits" of the early spring harvest (Lev 23, Exod 23, 34).



By the early New Testament period, it had gradually lost its association with agriculture and became associated with the celebration of God's creation of His people and their religious history. By the destruction of Jerusalem in AD 70, the festival focused exclusively on God's gracious gift of *Torah* (the "Law") on Mount Sinai. It continues to be celebrated in this manner in modern Judaism.

While there are other references to **Pentecost** in the New Testament (*e.g.* 1 Cor 16:8), it is most significant in Acts 2 and the familiar scene of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on those in the "upper room." The New Testament writers associate the events of Acts 2 with Pentecost, and relate it to the prophecies of Joel 2 and promises of Jesus (Acts 1:8). In both, the emphasis is on a empowerment through the Holy Spirit to enable the people of God to witness to Jesus the Christ.

There is much debate in some circles about exactly what happened at Pentecost, whether it is a repeatable event or only for the early church, or whether it should or should not become a paradigm for personal religious experience. Those who advocate it as a paradigm are sometimes termed Pentecostals, although that term usually refers more specifically to church traditions who advocate speaking in "tongues" or a special Spirit-inspired prayer or praise language.

In any case, what seems clear is that Pentecost represents God's gracious, enabling presence actively at work among His people, calling and enabling them to live out in dynamic ways the witness of being His people. Perhaps at this point there is direct contact with the Pentecost of Judaism, for in Judaism the Torah, God's instruction to His people, is the means by which they become His witness to the world.

The word "pentecost" means "fiftieth day." In most Christian traditions, Pentecost Sunday occurs 50 days following **Easter** Sunday (counting Easter Sunday since it is the first day of the week). Those 50 days span seven Sundays after Easter, so Pentecost is the seventh Sunday after Easter (7 weeks times 7 days = 49 days, plus Pentecost Sunday). Since Easter is a "movable feast," meaning that it occurs on different days in different years (it is tied to the lunar cycle while the calendar is solar based), Pentecost is also moveable. It can occur as early as May 10 and as late as June 13. for 2009 it is May 31.) Some Christian traditions, Eastern Orthodox for example, use a different religious calendar and so have different dates for much of the Christian Year.

The sanctuary color for Pentecost Sunday is **red**, the color of the church. Technically, red is used only for the Sunday of Pentecost, although some churches use red for the Sundays between Easter and Pentecost Sunday. The red symbolizes both the fire of Pentecost as well as the apostles and early followers of Jesus who were gathered in the Upper Room for the empowerment from God to proclaim the Gospel throughout the world.

or Christians, Pentecost Sunday is a day to celebrate hope, a hope evoked by the knowledge that God through His Holy Spirit is at work among His people. It is a celebration of newness, of recreation, of renewal of purpose, mission, and calling as God's people. It is a celebration of God's ongoing work in the world. Yet, it is also a recognition that His work is done through His people as He pours out His presence upon them.

Let us take this opportunity to be called to renew ourselves through the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives, by becoming an active part of 1st Presbyterian Church Duncanville. If you haven't already done so, please sign up to be a part of one of the church "teams", by providing your time and/or talent where needed to help renew this church in the community.


