Have you been watching the news lately? Boy has the world changed! Or has it? Take a look at these cultural statistics and guess the year:

- A moral breakdown occurred in both the public sector and private lives
- Intermarriage between believers and nonbelievers threatened the identity of the faithful
- Poor people mortgaged their property to sustain themselves through tough economic times, and found themselves foreclosed on

- Divorce was rampant
- Employees were cheated of their wages by employers
- Weekly worship was neglected for the growing demand to engage in business
- Nonpayment of tithes forced pastors to abandon their duties in order to make a living
- An attitude of apathy prevailed that there was no profit in being loyal to the faith

These cultural trends are actually from the year Nehemiah went to Jerusalem to fulfill the vision God gave him to rebuild the wall -445 B.C.E. Yet how familiar they sound! As Solomon said, "Nothing is new under the sun."

When the faithful are lethargic about the faith, the nation is quick to fall away from the hope that knowing God brings. Nehemiah tells us, though, that we have a mission; we can do something about it. Nehemiah knew what he was talking about for he left a lucrative job full of passion to do what God called him to do.

We, too, are called at FPCD to seek ways to bring the good news of Jesus Christ to our community. As we do that we engage in work which leads people to experience God's love and forgiveness, overcoming all kinds of injustice, immorality, and general discouragement. As we then learn to love God, things like integrity, character, and hope grow.

How do we catch the vision? We are well on the road and God will continue to lead us! So let's keep our eyes on the Master.

## SYMBOLS of our faith...Symbols of the Twelve Apostles

The twelve Apostles chosen by Jesus to be His special representatives were "Peter, James the son of Zebedee, John the brother of James, Andrew, Philip, Bartholomew, Matthew, Thomas, James the son of Alphaeus, Thaddaeus, Simon the Canaanite, and Judas Iscariot." Mark 3:16-19 They are frequently represented by symbols.


The usual symbol for Peter is two keys crossed in the form of the letter "X". The crossed keys recall Peter's confession and our Lord's gift to him of the keys to the kingdom, representing the power to bind and the power to loose. "And I will give unto thee the keys of the kingdom of heaven; and whatsoever thou shalt bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatsoever thou shalt loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." Matthew 16:18-19. Peter's shield is often displayed with a Latin cross turned upside down representing the traditional story of this death by upside down crucifixion at his request.

## June 2009

## ACTIVITY:

1. After the last heavy rains, there were small leaks noted in sound room. Christian Brothers Roofing are considering what to do next.
2. Lawn mowing and edging continues by church volunteers, Eddie Everett, Grant Everett, Anna Murphy, Nick Peacock, Dean Hertenstein, Lori Glover, Charlie Glover, and Paul Barton. Dick Bergman is maintaining lawn equipment as needed.
3. The flower watering team continues watering \& planting.
4. The sidewalk was repaired outside of Fellowship Hall. The railing on stairs outside kitchen will be repaired in July. We checked out an estimate for a wheelchair ramp from parking lot to office entrance. City requirements for this kind of ramp on public buildings really push the cost up, out of our range.
5. The Bartons cleaned out poison ivy in trash can area.
6. Due to water damage some kitchen cabinets will be replaced \& a new countertop must be installed. This is scheduled to be done in July.

TO DO:

1. Broken window in one of the primary rooms.
2. Front door on Fellowship hall needs replacement
3. Accordion doors in Fellowship hall need replacement.

We appreciate the thought but....please do not leave items at the church unless they have been requested for a specific purpose, such as furniture, desks, computer equipment, books, toys, etc. We want to keep our church buildings looking neat and clutterfree! Your cooperation is very much appreciated!!

Regarding the "rained out game":
