From Session - Scott Hartless

Every once in a while, I have to revisit some life lessons – vitally important lessons.

Let me share some examples.

- 1) To be done effectively, most things in life need to be learned and done repetitively. For example: we can brush and floss our teeth twice daily for decades, but if we stop one day and say "There! That ought to do it," it wouldn't be long before our teeth would begin to decay. This illustration presents a timeless principle that we don't need breakthrough knowledge as much as we need repetitive faithful action of knowledge we already have. I bet you might put daily Bible reading next to brushing your teeth as a good example of this principal.
- 2) Money is an all time big topic for Jesus. I remember saying to my father "If I had more money, I would have a better plan." He quickly responded, "I would suggest that if you had a better plan, you would have more money." You see, it's not the amount that counts; it's the plan that counts." Then dad asked how much money had I saved and invested (I was 40 at the time.) "None". He then asked, "Who sold you on that Plan?" Glad he didn't ask about my church contributions. This also goes for putting "things" back where they came from so that you can find them when you are looking for them - repetition.
- 3)The principal of putting things back in the same place from whence they came can be lifesaving, or a

killer. Let me tell you about a flight I had in an F-4 Phantom Jet. Pilots have an exercise they do called "Blindfold Cockpit Check." It's a simple game – put on a blindfold and have your partner state a switch, instrument, handle, etc. which you must identify by touching the correct item and position. Well, coming back home on a thoroughly boring cross country, our Air Cycle Machine came apart and caused a fire. NOT GOOD! The acrid cockpit environment cased my eyes to involuntarily shut tightly. Guess what - I now have to put the knowledge of where things are in the cockpit as if I was blindfolded. We were able to depressurize the plane - declare an emergency land and get the bird fixed and be our way. Repetition knowledge was literally a life saverl

To pull this together:

The Bible gives us an extensive list of human stories on both sides of the ledger. One list of human stories is used as examples for us – do what these people did. Another list of human stories is used as warnings – don't do what these people did.

So, If you should be asked how goes it - I certainly hope you can

say you were an example – not a warning.

Esther Bible Storytelling Project

Jim and I spent Easter this year in India launching a women's Bible storytelling project. Some of our colleagues asked, "Why would Seed Company organize a Bible storytelling project specifically for women?" Many people instinctively believe this is the right thing to do at this time. There is a growing global awareness of how women around the world are marginalized, meaning they have little access to health care, good food, education, and are often the target of violence and abuse.

And freeing the oppressed is a passion of our God. He told the Israelites to remember him as the God who heard their cries and brought them out of slavery in Egypt. And Jesus announced in the synagogue that the time had arrived for the fulfillment of Isaiah's prophecy:

"The Spirit of the LORD is upon me

for he has anointed me to bring Good News to the poor.

He has sent me to proclaim that captives will be released,

that the blind will see,

that the oppressed will be set free,

and that the time of the LORD's favor has come." (Luke 4:18-19 NLT)

So when our senior leader asked if we would be willing to work with partner organizations in India to run a project for training women to craft Bible stories in their languages and tell them around their communities, we agreed.

The project involves women from six language groups, only one of which has a NT already translated into their language. And we are training six Indian women to staff the project as trainers, managers and Bible story translation checkers. In this part of India, the illiteracy rate among women is in the single digits, and over 65% of the women and children suffer from malnutrition.

Since we held the first workshop over Easter, we thought it was fitting to start with the story from John about Mary Magdalene finding the tomb empty and then meeting Jesus standing outside of the tomb. He told her to go and tell his brothers that, "I am ascending to my father and your father, to my God and your God." (John 20:17b NLT) And she did. She found the disciples and said "I have seen the Lord." (NLT) And he is alive! (Janet's addition).

We are privileged to be a part of a project that helps women to understand that they have a legitimate place in God's kingdom and that the Bible is full of stories of women like Mary Magdalene who served God in amazing ways. Thanks for helping us to serve God through

the Bible storytelling among those without access to the Bible.
