From your Session

This is the year of my 80th birthday and 50th wedding anniversary. (Nancy & I were married in Nigeria in an Episcopal church by a Methodist minister from Dublin, Ireland.) This gives me a reason to look back at the 70 plus years I have been a believer. I thank God for so many, many things, but what have I learned that is important enough to share with you?

One of the conclusions I have come to about the Christian life is that maturity only comes as a result of difficulties. It is only when you face serious problems that you discover the power of God as it relates to YOUR life. Peter wrote: "These trials are only to test your faith, to show that it is strong and pure...and your faith is far more precious to God than mere gold. So, if your faith remains strong after being tried by fiery trials, it will bring much praise and glory and honor on the day when Jesus Christ is revealed to the whole world."

What have been my most difficult trials? Suddenly becoming responsible for the survival of the family farm at 17 and dealing with the loss of all our milk cows to disease and crop failure from drought; being a Field Director in Nigeria when some 40 of us were expelled in 1976 for unfair political reasons; again as a Field Director in Sudan in the '80s, dealing with working where there is a long term civil war; dealing with personnel problems of staff under me.

This church is now one area of my service to God and I pray that the church will grow in depth and numbers. When I see the problems we face as a church, I should not fret. God's will for me is to be found faithful in my personal life as I continue my walk with Him. My favorite professor in Bible College put it like this, "Never be satisfied with your spiritual life." The Biblical principle that God's power is usually limited when things are not right in our own life should not be taken lightly.

Reaching out with the gospel in America is much harder than it used to be or in Africa today. I talked with Dr. Peterson (who spoke May 3rd) about how hard it is for a small church to grow. He feels Americans typically view church with a consumerism attitude, i.e. that they are free to pick and choose what is enjoyable and satisfying just like they choose movies or a particular brand of whatever with little realization of a need for serious commitments of time and money. We have a difficult task but God is at work in the world today.



Cook's Corner

Lemon Cheesecake Bars

from Linda Simons

This recipe can be made with just a full-size food processor to save on cleanup.

Crust layer:

³/₄ cup butter, cold

2 cups flour

½ cup packed light brown sugar

1/4 tsp. salt

Cheesecake layer:

8 oz. cream cheese, room temperature

½ cup sugar

1 egg

2 Tbsp. milk

1 Tbsp. lemon juice

1 tsp. vanilla

Lemon Layer:

4 large eggs

1½ cups sugar

½ cup lemon juice

zest of one lemon, in very small pieces

¹⁄₃ cup flour

a couple drops of yellow food coloring, if desired

Preheat oven to 325 degrees and prepare a 9X13 baking pan by spraying with oil spray or lining with foil.

Crust layer: In a food processor, combine cold butter, flour, brown sugar and salt. Pulse until butter is incorporated and mixture looks like corn meal.

Pour into the 9x13 inch pan, smooth out with hand, then use a flat-bottomed cup to press down and even out. Bake for 12 minutes. Remove from oven.

Cheesecake layer: Wipe out (but don't wash) food processor and use to combine cream cheese, and sugar. Process until smooth and creamy. Add the egg, milk, lemon juice, and vanilla. Pour cheesecake over warm crust, tip pan to make sure batter gets to all corners.

Bake for 15 minutes. Remove and reduce oven to 300 degrees.

Lemon Layer: Rinse out food processor bowl, but no need to dry. Add eggs, sugar, lemon juice, lemon zest, flour and food coloring until combined. Pour slowly and carefully over the warm cheesecake layer so as to not breakup the cheesecake layer. Bake for an additional 25-30 minutes until lemon layer is set. Remove from the oven and cool.

For serving, bars are good refrigerated, and can be sprinkled with powdered sugar for a nice touch. Be prepared when asked for the recipe!
