The Pearl Necklace

My daughter recently reminded me of the sweet pearl necklace story she remembers from her youth and I wanted to remind you of it or to share it with you if the story is new to you.

The story is about Jenny, who was almost five years old. Jenny saw a pearl necklace at the dime store that she fell in love with. But since it cost almost \$2, she would have to see how much money was in her piggy bank, do extra chores and maybe use her birthday dollar to buy it. When she was finally able to purchase the little necklace, she wore it everywhere and only took it off when she went swimming or had a bubble bath.

This little girl had a dear father who read her a bedtime story every night. One night when he finished the story, he asked, "Jenny, do you love me?" Jenny said, "Oh, yes, Daddy. You know that I love you." "Then give me your pearls," he answered. "Oh, Daddy not my pearls, but you can have my favorite white horse from my collection. The one with the pink tail!" Her daddy said, "That's ok, Honey. Daddy loves you" and he kissed her good night. About a week later, after story time, Jenny's daddy asked again, "Do you love me?" Jenny answered again, "Daddy, you know I love you." "Then give me your pearls," he said. "Oh, Daddy, not my pearls, but you can have my new baby doll that I got for my birthday," answered Jenny. "That's okay. Daddy loves you." And he kissed her good night.

A few nights later when Jenny's daddy came in, she was sitting on her bed. He noticed that her chin was trembling and one silent tear rolled down her cheek. "What is it, Jenny? What's
