SYMBOLS of our faith...Symbols of the Twelve Apostles

Words from Worship

The twelve Apostles chosen by Jesus to be His special representatives were "Peter,

James the son of Zebedee, John the brother of James, Andrew, Philip, Bartholomew, Matthew, Thomas, James the son of Alphaeus, Thaddaeus, Simon the Canaanite, and Judas Iscariot." Mark 3:16 The scriptures inform us that James was the first of the disciples to die a martyr's death, and indeed the only one whose manner of death is exactly known. Acts 12:2 informs us that James was martyred for the faith by way of a sword.



He was ready to die with Jesus when Christ went to Jerusalem, but is best remembered for doubting the Resurrection until allowed to touch Christ's wounds. Preached in Parthia, Persia and India, though he was so reluctant to start the mission that he had to be taken into slavery by a merchant headed that way. He eventually gave in to God's will, was freed, and planted the new Church over a wide area. He formed many parishes and built many churches along the way. His symbol is the builder's square, from an ancient story that built a palace for King Guduphara in India.



As most of you have noticed, a lot of things have changed at our church. We have a renewed desire to follow the leading of the Holy Spirit and to trust in God. Rev. Tom Wylie, First Presbyterian Church-Idaho Falls, will be traveling to the area, with seven youth and three adults, arriving on August 1, to participate in the Summer Visiting Youth Program at first Presbyterian Church Dallas. Five of FPCD youth are signed up to participate in this program with FPCIF youth. The group will be housed at First Presbyterian Church Dallas, Sunday—Thursday night.

The Program focuses on homelessness, inner-city children, domestic violence, and aging. During the week they will serve meals at the Bridge (Stewpot); serve as junior counselors for the week at a summer day camp program for inner-center children; tour a women's shelter and learn more about domestic violence; tour a facility and play with the children of a day care center for homeless children; and tour and visit with residents of Grace Presbyterian Village.

The group will be staying at FPC Dallas Sunday-Thursday. Since the Idaho Falls group will be staying over until Sunday, August 8, we are seeking housing for them for Friday and Saturday nights as well as providing group meals. We will need meals on Friday & Saturday nights, picnic lunch on Saturday \and lunch on Sunday. Host families are also asked to provide breakfast for your house guests. If you are available to help with housing, meals, or




