

We received another letter from the Shaefers this spring – in April – and though delayed, we will pass on their news to you this month. Please see bottom of page for prayer request just received (June 21)!

Dear Friends,

Paul made a visit to Gbenfu today, a remote Safaliba Village, of the people group we serve. He went with two Safaliba co-workers, Amaaliya and Iddi, to launch literacy classes there.

Amaaliya had made several trips to Gbenfu in the previous month in preparation for this, and took Iddi with him on one of the trips. Gbenfu is a small town of several hundred people. There are only a very few Christians there, and their church activity has been very intermittent over the years because it is such an out-of-the-way place that outside pastors and evangelists don't get there regularly.

Pray that this literacy outreach will be effective and that the small gathering of Christians will grow once they have and can read the scriptures.

On one of his recent trips to Gbenfu, Amaaliya took copies of the Safaliba scripture booklets published recently: Judges 2 and 13-16 with the story of Samson, and the book of Ruth. According to what he told us, there are about 40 people in Gbenfu who are very eager to start learning to read and who are waiting to meet with us.

We've also been working on the translation of the last bit of Genesis, chapters 1 through 11. Please **pray** as we finish the process of checking through these chapters.

Thank you for praying for our family. We are all doing well*, and the kids are making good progress on their schoolwork. This past Saturday we, as we often do, took a hike back behind our house to "the big rocks" (granite outcroppings). Everybody was excited to see that the recent rains had left pools of water in which there are now tadpoles and frogs at various stages of development!
