(see Deut. 6). Think about it. Those words were spoken some 3,200 years ago, and here we are – believers, part of the family of God, embracing that very message. We are God's people who still enact that first promise to be a people who bless the world with the message of salvation.

To learn how to share that message this fall we will leave the OT and fast forward to the New Testament 1,200 years later, and join the disciples in the book of Acts. We will learn from them, as they continue to tell God's story of love for all people. The message of the gospel is indeed good news; worthy news for people in Duncanville. Let's learn to share it well, first with our children, and then with others around us. Thank you for your enthusiasm for the gospel, your active participation in ministry, and your deep love for Jesus Christ. Amen? Amen.

#### PROPERTY NEWS

A building renovation fund has been started with a gift of \$2000. This gift has been designated toward making the Fellowship Hall restrooms handicap accessible. The estimate that we have received to update the restrooms is \$16,685, therefore we have received more than 10% so far!

As most of you know, we had a celebration at the church on Sunday, July 4 to rejoice in the improvements that we have made in the office area, library, and Christian Education wing. We also talked about the things that remain to be done in the Fellowship Hall and adjoining areas, such as renovation of the restrooms to comply with requirements for handicap accessibility, new folding chairs, new storage closet for tables and chairs, new flooring and paint in the Fellowship Hall, in the classrooms off the Fellowship Hall, and in the kitchen.

We all want our church to be a place that will draw people, make them comfortable, meet their needs, and in so doing, reflect the love of God to all. As Pastor Ginger has told us many times in her sermons, God is present and powerful. Once we are connected to God, all things are possible. We hope you will prayerfully consider contributing to this most important endeavor in the coming months. Together we can accomplish amazing things!



#### MISSIONARY UPDATE

Míssíonary Update



Greetings from this very hot capital city of Niger. Typically these days temperatures are high 110s with 90s at night and high humidity. Many succumb to the heat; on the way to the children's school we have to pass the city morgue where crowds gather to claim those who have not survived. It affects us too, sapping energy and trying our spirits.

When we test a translation with mother tongue speakers, it is at times boring. We read the text to someone who is unfamiliar with it then ask questions to see what they understood. However, the other day things got a bit more interesting. We were testing with two men, one who did not like the fact that the other 'A' is a follower of Christ and began to try to criticize the life of Christians and evangelize him to his own faith. Knowing only the street rumors of what a Christian was – an immoral Westerner who doesn't pray, who drinks alcohol and eats pork—he accused 'A' of all this. Then he was surprised that "A" didn't immediately repent and confess. 'A' had never done any of these things; his reaction was anger. Later Carlos had an opportunity to talk to 'A' about forgiveness and praying for one's enemies.

Sometimes we work with those who are not followers of Christ. 'M' has agreed to work with us in back translation (the text is retranslated into French so that the consultant who does not know the language can know whether or not we translated what we were supposed to). Sometimes the work with the team brings problems to those on the team. 'M' has experienced some problems as well. Carlos has had some opportunities to talk to 'M' when the Lord opens the way. As Caryn develops friendships with his wife, she also learns the language. Pray that the Lord would give us opportunities to be salt and light and to be able to say what makes us different . . . that is not just our ethnicity and culture.


