From our Elder—Scott

Fresh Paint

Did you notice something fresh when you came in last Sunday morning? Did you notice the scent of . . . *fresh paint*?

I gave a little talk that Sunday, starting out with a paint roller, “painting” the platform in front of the sanctuary. The congregation seemed to be amused at the spectacle . . . “Why are you all laughing?” I exclaimed; “This is going to be your job in not the most distant future . . . is to paint the other half of the church. This half has been painted . . . you did notice in the rain . . . its gorgeous . . . lack of color . . . it was the right kind of cream colored paint . . . Did you notice that?”

“How many of you were here painting? How do you think that got done? You guys didn’t show up! Money was provided. And we hired somebody as a replacement painter so that you didn’t have to do it.”

“It was an old thing in the Revolutionary War days, that they would hire other people to go fight the war, and they got to stay home. This is kind of the same thing here with the painting.”

“I didn’t have enough money . . . to hire somebody else . . . But I’m going to find some soon! Because we need to paint the outside of the fellowship hall, the office area and the children’s area . . . and you don’t want to know what it’s going to look like when I finish! And then you’re going to be painting over it anyway.”

“So the question is: Do you wish to be a painter? . . . or provide some funds so that we can have somebody else to do this painting, and it’ll look a whole lot better than when I get through with it.”

“So when we start calling around and asking . . . for *painters* you’ll know we’re asking for . . . *money*.”

Note from Session: We have indeed completed painting the exterior of the Sanctuary. It’s beautiful, it’s nice and fresh. We actually received a grant from Highland Park Presbyterian Church to help us with painting this building. However, we get to do the other one on our own. The cost of painting the Fellowship Hall, the office area and the children’s area is \$7,570 with an additional \$930 to replace the deteriorating doors leading into the Fellowship Hall. We want to just finish the other building now – that’s the most expedient thing. So please consider helping us to do that today.

Hi, friends at FPCD. It has been almost a year since we left Duncanville. A lot of life happens in that time, both in your spot on the globe, and the one where we now are. We've had all sorts of times.

Exhausting ones:

The first two weeks we were back here, we didn't have our own place, phones, or bikes to get around. The noise and jostling on the streets irritated me. We didn't know where to get food that was appetizing to us. I remember standing in tears and talking to Father about how I wasn't sure I could do this.



Fun ones:

In the fall we organized a gathering of the expat kids in town. The group met weekly. We celebrated things like Pi Day by playing math games and eating pie.

Happy ones:

A group of Zee village ladies gave me a beautiful quilt with the characters they had embroidered on it. It was a thank you for helping them learn to read. I was touched.

Stretching ones:

A few weeks ago, a former classmate of Dales invited our family to eat with them. The invitation morphed; the time and place changed once or twice. In the end, Dennis and I couldn't be there and our kids ended up behind a podium at a middle school, expected to teach English to several hundred students. After that, we did all go to the friend's house for a meal.

Grateful ones:

We have seen the Zee body deepen and grow. More songs, more parts of the book, more abundant life.

Stressful ones:

Just the last two weeks, Dale had emergency surgery to remove a ruptured appendix. It was a difficult time. Nonetheless, Father touched us with peace.

Thanks for holding the rope for us. You have sent us as an extension of the Body to be here in this place among the Zee. Your support, prayers, and interest mean so much to us. It gives us joy and sustain us.

Christian Education

Children's Sunday School is using a combined format for the summer--preschool through 6th grade are all in one class. We are studying the Ten Commandments for the summer, covering one commandment each week. Students are each making an accordion sign listing a short version of all commandments. Every week we add one more to the finger play we are using to memorize the Big Ten. Also, we've enjoyed an animated video series every other week about the Ten Commandments. Miss Marna has been teaching some Ten Commandment songs including "Only Elohim," which is about Commandment One.

The staff have been trying to figure out a way to rig up some older audio-video equipment so that we can have options for projecting song words, showing illustrative photos, and watching video for a large classroom of students. We're using the church's older video projector hooked up to personal computers in an attempt to bring Sunday School into the 21st century! :-)

We are hoping for some additional staff for the fall, so be ready to say "yes" when we come begging for help. If we can find additional teachers, we will subdivide our large class into groups with smaller age ranges.

FPCD YOUTH

This past month has been an exciting and challenging month for The Closet. Many students went on vacation during July, so sometimes students missed a week or two of youth group at a time. This made it difficult to plan some lessons, but nonetheless we still tackled some important topics! In the high school Sunday school class we have been reading through the book of Romans and looking at the reason for which the book was written. This has led us to some interesting conversations on how the book of Romans can give us insight into today's world; like ethnically Jewish Christians and Gentile Christians in Christ's time, today we can realize that we are all equal in God's eyes and should not pass judgment on one another. On Wednesday nights, the youth has been tackling topics such as why to follow Jesus and be a Christian.

In July the youth group also went on our yearly mission trip. We enjoyed a service-filled (but fun) week in downtown Dallas. We worked with FPCDallas' Summer Kids' Club, had an exciting Splash Day with Vogel Alcove, sorted food at North Texas Food Bank, visited with residents at Grace Presbyterian Village, held a Bible study at the Stewpot, and served food and water at the Bridge. The youth all loved giving our time and effort to organizations that are working to better our community. We also learned how important it is to turn our ideas into actions; we can't just *think* about helping our community, we need to *do* it!

August is going to be an exciting time for The Closet. We are looking forward to pool parties and learning about relationship boundaries, forgiveness, and conflict resolution.
