From Pastor Steve Netniss

Over the last four years I have emphasized the big story of the Bible with our youth group. Simply put, the big story of the Bible is:

God created a good world (Genesis 1-2)

The good world went bad (Genesis 3)

God will eventually renew it (Revelation 21-22).

There are times when we are tempted to gravitate toward one extreme of the story. What I mean is that some Christians see everything in a positive manner 1-2),(Genesis while others constantly complain everything is broken (Genesis 3), and then there are the Christians who are so consumed with going to heaven that they're no earthly good!

I believe our society is hungry for the big story of the Bible.

We don't believe all the positivefeel good messages that ignore reality. How can we pretend that everything is great in the world when Christians in Iraq are being persecuted for their faith? On the other hand, the doomsday predictions and obsession with the afterlife just isn't working either.

Instead, we want to celebrate the good, admit our flaws, and live with the confidence that God has not given up on his creation.

So what does all this mean for FPCD? One of the things I love about FPCD is that we tell the big story. Every week we proclaim that God is good, we confess our sins, and we hear a sermon and songs that inspire.

FPCD will continue to live the big story. We will celebrate all good things that are happening in our community. We sing to the Lord, proclaim his word, and learn the way of Christ. We have smart, generous, servant-hearted and compassionate leaders. At the same time, we recognize that there are areas we can improve. We don't have all the answers and we're honest about our weaknesses. We have patience and encourage one another. Finally, while we pursue the Lord and proclaim his word, we do it with the hope that we are working with God toward the reconciliation of all things.

I encourage you to live out the big story in your life. The best is yet to come!

Mission News

An Update from Paul and Jennífer Schaefer Dear friends,

Thank you for your prayers over the last few months as we returned to Ghana and began the settling in process again. Going both ways-- from Ghana to the US and then from the US to Ghana again--require significant transitions and changes in daily routines. During these times of transition, prayer is essential. For that we thank you all.

We landed back in Ghana on March 13th after a challenging fall and spring when Jen's grandfather died, Sarah broke her arm and Jen had gallbladder surgery. The Lord put all the pieces together for our return. He did not stop there; our re-entry process was smooth, especially since we left a cold winter to return in the middle of "hot season" here in Ghana.

We were able to clean and organize our house again after a year and a half away, get the kids back in school and meet with each of the translation and literacy team members, all in the first six weeks back. At the same time, Paul met with the administration of the Ghana Education Service in Bole and the head teacher in Mandari to prepare for a literacy workshop at the end of May to the middle of June. This workshop began the process of having Safaliba taught in the primary schools. English is the main language for education in Ghana, but studies show that children who first learn their mother-tongue before transitioning to the language of wider communication do much better in the long run. This, along with furthering Safaliba reading in general, is our aim.

Right after the literacy workshop, Paul also helped out briefly with teaching two chapters for the Deuteronomy translation workshop in Tamale.

Since then, we've been focusing more on translation in two areas: first, we've begun the revision of the book of James, and secondly, we've begun the research process before starting on the exegetical check of Colossians. Please pray with us for these two projects. We hope to complete them in the next couple months.

The children are all very happy to be back "home" with their friends, animals and trees to climb. They are making good progress in school as well as making time to enjoy life here in Ghana. This has also been a year of age milestones: Caleb is now 16, Micah turns 13 in about a week, Josiah is 10 and Sarah 7. They are all growing and learning so much.


Thank you for all your prayers and encouragement. Just as each member of the body is needed for the building up of the body, so this translation task is a joint, group effort. Thank you for your part in it!
