From our Elders

More Blessings than You Can Imagine By Tom Harmon

Have you ever attended a church retreat, Sunday School class, or some other event sponsored by the church and been asked to tell the group how and when you became a Christian? If your response has been the same as mine, you begin to shake, rattle and roll! What am I going to say this time? Some people don't have any problem answering this question - they know exactly the date, time and place they became a Christian. It could have been in a Sunday School class in their youth, at a Christian summer camp, or during a restless night when they knew God spoke to them.

Over the years, I've learned to not panic when I have to answer this question. I know my story and exactly how I became a Christian. The answer is, I've always been a Christian! My choice to follow Jesus Christ had its beginnings at Sunday School--even as early as when I played in the sandbox there. God quarded my life even when at the age of one I was required to be in a children's hospital for twelve months. My parents didn't have a car, but did manage to go the 200 miles to visit me every two weeks. The doctors were there to care for me and watch over me for years to make sure that I could walk in a straight line! God's plan for my life was beginning to take shape. In the ensuing years, God continued to shape my life. I was blessed with one especially good Sunday School teacher who taught me for at least 5 of my formative years. Although my father didn't attend church, my mother insisted that we four kids go to Sunday School and church every Sunday. We had many years of perfect attendance! I was also blessed with a grandfather who came to pick us up and took our mother and us to church. I can still hear him coughing every Sunday morning the whole two miles or so to the church. Then every summer, one week after school stopped, we were back in the same classrooms to attend Summer Bible school for two weeks!

I'm convinced that God was in charge of my life in 1955 when He "made arrangements" for me to befriend a life guard at a state park where I had a summer job. One day, in response to the life guard's question "Where are you going to go to college?", my answer was that I probably wouldn't

Missions News

News from Niger

(Carlos and Caryn Benitez serve in Niger. Letters from them are often posted on the bulletin board in the Sunday School foyer.)

I Peter 1:25 "... the word of the Lord stands forever. "

People prayed and God moved. There is no other explanation for what we have seen here recently, despite some difficult situations.



Over the past three months, the team has consultant-checked the last 25 chapters of Genesis, and is now in the process of printing it in Roman script. We hope to print in Ajami script* soon after. At the same time, the team has begun testing the first portion of Exodus, and we hope to begin testing the second half of Exodus and other selections of the Pentateuch in the near future. The Lord truly has done marvelous things!



Recently, a committee of speakers of 'A' and 'H's' language asked Carlos to give a lecture at the university about their language. Since in the past most speakers wanted nothing to do with us, this was an opportunity we could not pass up! To a packed audience, Carlos, along with a historian, explained the history and language of the people as distinct from neighboring peoples and languages. Now for the first time since we arrived in 1999, people who in the past

would not even acknowledge Carlos are going out of their way to greet him. (It's a little hard to get used to!) Please pray that this would lead to an acceptance of the translation.

At the same time that so many wonderful things are happening, we are watching events in the region with concern. One neighboring country has seen a series of religiously motivated attacks and reprisals. At the same time, governments in several other neighboring countries have fallen. These events directly affect the language groups we are working in. Pray that God would raise up peacemakers.

In June, we started a home assignment, during which we hope to see many of you. In the mean-time, 'A' and 'H' are trained to continue translation in our absence. Please pray for the entire team—'A' and 'H' and 'B'—that they would work well together and become integrated into a single team. Pray also for 'M', the team leader, as he now coordinates work in two different languages.

It's hard to believe that in a few weeks we will be seeing some of you in person! The children, and Caryn as a teacher, have finished another school year here—and soon school will begin in the US!



When we settled in Duncanville in 1982 we were welcomed by this church family. Through the thirty years we have worshipped and worked in this church, I have learned a great deal about what following Christ means. I've also come to love this church deeply.

After I retired, God had another blessing for me when a friend of mine invited me to a Rotary club. You see, I had been concerned about what I could do in my retirement to give back to the community. God is in control, indeed!
