Dear church family in Duncanville,

Although we moved to Manassas, VA a year ago, we have not forgotten you! We appreciate keeping in touch as we receive prayer requests and things to praise God for, and even visits from some FPCD friends!

And we appreciate you there who pray for us and support us in other ways. As we start our 49th year with Wycliffe and SIL, our job is essentially what it was when we were in Dallas: editing books about languages, cultures, translation, and literacy. We take good things that people have written (for example, on Biblical Hebrew [George] and languages of Nepal [Mary]), and do all we can to facilitate people using the final publications (whether in print or on line) in their service to thousands of language groups around the world. Our audience includes Bible translators, linguists, pastors, mission organizations, and workers with the UN, non-profits and government agencies.

We're very glad to be near our daughter Jill and her family, as well as many other kin, and to be helping with internationals in our local church. We're a day's drive from our son Lars and his family in NC. He and Kathy recently moved from Wycliffe to a new organization, OneHundred-Fold (OHF), to concentrate on other facets of Bible-focused language development. 
The "committee" has been meeting for several weeks now, but your help is also needed. As we fine tune the schedule and activities, we will make you aware of volunteer opportunities that are available.
