Christian Unity

In today's world there are many things that serve to divide people, including Christians. We have to be very careful in what we do or say in order to show people that being a Christian makes us different in a positive way. At every level, internationally, nationally, statewide, or locally, there seems to be the need not only to be right but to demonize any who disagree with us.

One issue is the acceptance of foreigners into our country whether these be refugees or immigrants coming across our southern border. For some this is easy, since we are told in the Bible to accept these groups. But it gets more complicated when ISIS says they will send jihadists with the refugees with the plan to kill people who disagree with them. When we see incidents such as San Bernardino and Orlando this becomes a very real threat. While most coming across the southern border are just coming for a better life, there are some who are criminals or are part of the drug cartel. There is also the question of how we pay for this when we are over \$19 trillion in debt. We have many unemployed in this country so a large increase in work force can only increase the number unemployed. There are good people on both those for unlimited acceptance and those who see the dangers. Calling the other side naïve or racist doesn't help solve the problem.

Another area is in helping the poor. All Christians believe that is our duty, but there is a big disagreement over how to do it. I have read some who call themselves the "Christian left" say that any true Christian should support and vote for those who want to increase spending for any and all programs that serve the poor. Others would ask if that is not turning over our responsibility to the government. Are people who want the government to help the poor better Christians than those who willingly work with and donate to non-government groups who help the poor? Those who are not in total support of government point out that when government does it, a large sum of money is needed for the bureaucracy to administer the programs. The larger the government program, the more opportunity for fraud and waste.

Our denomination has been divided by the acceptance of gays into church leadership positions and gay marriage. I would hope all Christians would be against mistreatment of gay people. Although there are not clear statements about gays in the Bible, Christians have to use other statements to determine our position on the issue. The Bible talks of marriage as between a man and a woman. The gay lifestyle would seem to not be consistent with the behavior described for Christians. My understanding is that as Christians we need to be welcoming to all people. But we are also supposed to encourage them to live a Christian lifestyle. Do we sometimes stress accepting everyone as they are so much that we don't expect them to move toward being more like Christ? Christ forgave sin but then said "Go and sin no more". Are we saying join us and no change necessary?

I have tried not to tell anyone which side he or she should be on. I feel each person needs to determine his or her position through reading the Bible and praying. We need to be sure that our disagreements be discussed in a respectful manner and not overshadow our agreement on the main issue that Jesus Christ is our Lord and Savior and His way is the true way.

One way to help demonstrate our unity, is through a joint festival titled "Community in Unity" put on by 10 churches. It our chance to present to the Duncanville community a unified voice of our Christianity. Help us as we work toward this goal.


