# What's going on in **Ezra** and **Nehemiah?**

A few months ago Pastor Ginger asked us to read a portion of the Old Testament book, Nehemiah. I felt perhaps I should read the entire book and the closely-linked book Ezra. I had an idea that I might better "get the picture" if I let my mind be saturated with this Scripture rather than just read once, casually. Over a few weeks I read the two books several times, from both Contemporary English Version and The Message. That experience is another story, very worth doing, though you might want to zip through the extensive lists of names. If you don't have a modern English version, this might be a good time to get one!

These books contain a lot of action! The scene opens with the Jews in captivity, enslaved, but God speaks to the king who is holding them captive. The king allows, even urges, the Jews to return to the homeland and rebuild the temple. They do, and eventually they also rebuild the city walls. We also read of ups and downs: renewed commitment to God, falling away, the rise of an uncarbureaucracy, repentance and restoration of right-relations, persecution, fighting. I hope I've withheld enough detail that you'll want to read the rest of the story in these books! ©

#### What did I learn?

\* I tried putting myself in their place in these books. The Jews are God's people here and throughout the Bible. As a follower of Jesus, I'm privileged to also be one of God's people. The lessons of the people in Ezra and Nehemiah should be my lessons too.

- \* God remembers and cares about me (his people) even if I'm bogged down in slavery and out of touch with him.
- God sometimes chooses to work for my benefit through a surprising individual (the king); he might bring that person to be his follower in the meantime.
- I quickly fall out of touch with God if I neglect reading Scripture. In Nehemiah 8, the people were deeply moved when the Law of God was read to them, and they recommitted themselves to doing what God commanded.
- Temptations to not follow God's leading are often present.
- Prayers by leaders for God's people should become my concerns too. (Ezra 9, 10).
- \* I should expect persecution. In some cases it's best to ignore it, and in others resistance is appropriate.
- God is ready to receive and restore me to being in touch with him if I repent.
- Repentance and return to God bring rejoicing.

The \$1 bill replies, "Oh, I've been to the Methodist Church, the Baptist Church, the Catholic Church, the Lutheran Church


The twenty dollar bill interrupts, "What's a church?"
