

Once again, this year, FPCD will support **Duncanville Police Department's Santa Cop Program**. They've been doing this program for over 20 years. Last year, the program assisted more than 25 Duncanville families and more than 91 children as a result of the generosity from the public.



While toys are accepted for children of all ages, FPCD is trying to focus mainly on gifts for older children, ages 12-16, because they are often overlooked. Suggested items for this age are:

* Girls: makeup, craft making items, scarves and jewelry

Boys: sports balls, earbuds, college or pro sports apparel

Please bring your new, unwrapped items to the church by **Sunday**, **December 17** and place in the tubs marked "Santa Cops" in the Narthex.

Gifts for Seniors is a new program being run by Linda Dean Miley through her new non-profit, Help to Heal. She is collecting items to give to bless senior adults who are lonely this Christmas. She will accept any donation that would make a good gift for a senior adult, but suggests stuffed animals, soft blankets, warm socks with non-slip grips on the bottom, and restaurant gift cards. She would also appreciate blank Christmas cards and wrapping paper.

Rice Krispy Treats Shared by Anna Murphy

Cook 1 cup Karo Light Corn Syrup & 1 cup sugar together in a large sauce pan over medium heat, stirring until sugar dissolves.


Bring mixture to a boil and immediately remove from heat. Stir in 1 cup creamy peanut butter; mix well.

Add **6 cups crispy rice cereal**; stir until evenly coated. Pour into greased 13x9 inch pan and pat into place.

Optional chocolate topping:

Melt 1 cup semisweet chocolate chips and 1 cup butterscotch chips together in saucepan over low heat, stirring constantly. Spread over cereal. Cool at least 45 minutes or until firm.

Cut into bars. Enjoy!
