
"That's when I was carrying you."

During the course of the year, PW has held several projects to raise funds for the Duncanville Community Choir's trip to New York in November to participate in the singing of Handel's Messiah at Carnegie Hall. We held two plant sales, one at church and one at the Duncan Switch market, where we raised \$1,200 together; a garage sale in August at the church which we extended from one Saturday to the next in which we raised \$950; and now the cookbook.
