### From your Session

As we enter November and are nearing the end of the year, I think we should reflect on 2019, our declared year of prayer. Personally, I've had plenty of opportunity to put prayer into practice. I'd say honestly the first half of the year was pretty positive prayer. I was feeling very powerful and life felt so pleasant. We (the Session) were meeting weekly, planning and working on fostering prayer in our congregation and neighborhood. We were able to (with tremendous help) create and hand out booklets about our prayer initiative and design and launch a website where the city could be united through prayer, no matter the denomination or walk of faith they were on - all are welcome!

This prayer initiative became more than just project. It shifted something in the way I thought of prayer. I at some point became my own prayer project. This prayer initiative, intended for those around me, began initiating intentional prayer in my life. This new flame was ignited, an excitement that I can't really describe. I felt like some prayer superhero and perhaps that's what part of the project was for, to reeducate me on what prayer truly is. I was suddenly running up to the front line with my helmet half on and sword a little too heavy to carry to rush off as a prayer warrior. The reality was that I still had some experience to gain.

Early on in the year, in the springtime, my family was given some news. Our cousins, that we are very close with and are still very young, had just learned that their father was very ill - the big C. We were all pretty shocked. He was so young, and this came so suddenly. Where did it come from, and why did it think it could just invade our lives this way?! I was surprised, but not worried. I was confident we were just going to pray it away.

As the weeks went by and then months of non-end prayer and then opposite results, I began to fear that my prayers were not aligning with God's will, and then my prayers began to change. From rejection to acceptance, and yet in both for strength and healing. Then as summer began, we got the news. Again, I was shocked, I was in disbelief. How could this be the result? I knew we had been praying hard and faithfully. This could not be the response! And yet, it was.

I was hurt and angry. This was not fair! They had already gone through so much and now this! How could this be right? Why would this even be happening? Why hadn't my prayers "worked"? Was I not as good at praying as I believed I was? \*Spoiler alert\* I do learn that prayer is not a direct line to God to grant my requests. It's not like I didn't already know that but I guess sometimes I forget what prayer is. Even though prayer has the power to connect us with God given miracles, prayer is not divine miracle shopping.

Living through that experience, was many things, and one thing that it was, was a confidence shaker. How could I pray again for others? They had counted on me.

Fast forward a couple months to some more tragic family news. Our 8-year-old cousin has been diagnosed with a brain tumor. How ever would we overcome this? I remember talking to my sister and saying, "I feel so bad there is nothing I could say or do to help them through this." (I'm about to brag on my sister right now.) She said, "You can offer them prayer." That's all she said! And it hit me like a ton of bricks! How could I forget the value of prayer? The power of prayer? The gift of prayer?

Her response was so simple and yet so mighty! Let us celebrate prayer. It is real and true, for everyone and anyone, anywhere and everywhere. Prayer is uplifting and a source of strength, even if the prayer is a silent cry from the heart. Prayer connects us to our Creator - our God who is bigger than our problems. 
