From your Session

Welcome to 2020 and a new year ahead. May it be one that brings good health and happiness and one that also brings us to a new and more meaningful relationship with the Lord. In these times when there are so many not so good things happening, isn't it wonderful that we have the Lord to walk with us, to carry us through sometimes, and to be our rock and redeemer!

As a member of Session as well as Clerk of Session, one of the items on our agenda for 2020 is to keep you, the congregation, aware of who we are and what our responsibilities are. We are, after all, elected by you to serve for you. Our active or "ruling" elders number six usually; however, just last month, one of our members, Vanessa Cordova, moved away. Since her term of office ends June 30, 2020 and with only six months remaining, we decided to wait until June when we elect new elders to bring our number back to six. Current Session members are: Marna Bayless, Paul Griffith, Sean Russell, Jeff Thorpe and me. Pastor Ginger is Moderator of Session.

Session meets monthly. First and foremost, as spiritual leaders, we begin each meeting with a devotional of some type to help guide our spiritual growth; to help discern what direction God has for us as a church. And as spiritual leaders, we spend time in prayer. The remainder of each meeting is devoted to church operations. We review financial reports, minutes of previous session and/or congregational meetings and act upon items brought to us for decision. We are responsible to you for the financial

well-being of the church, upkeep of our facilities and personnel (other than the pastor); in general, the overall operation of the church. In addition, we take turns writing this column for the newsletter and serve on the "end-of-service" ministry team where an elder and a deacon are available for prayer immediately after each worship service. We are supported by the Deacons and all other teams. We couldn't complete our responsibilities to you without this support.

In order to become an elder, you must be a member of the church. The Nominating Committee meets annually to prepare a slate of candidates for the office of elder. They review candidates who have been suggested, pray about the candidates and then meet the candidates individually. If the candidate agrees, their name is placed in nomination for election at a congregational meeting. Nominees can also be presented from the floor at such a meeting with one stipulation: that the candidate is aware beforehand and willing to have their name placed in nomination. Once elected, you are ordained as an elder. You will remain an elder for life but the term of office for an active or ruling elder is three years. According to Presbyterian policy, you may serve a maximum of two terms or six years consecutively as a ruling elder.

And now we come to a dilemma. Last June when the Nominating Committee conducted its due diligence and met with numerous candidates, no one was available or willing to serve. In order to continue our work, we asked one of our active elders to go beyond his six years and serve another year which he graciously agreed to do. This June we will need at least two new candidates to serve on Session. Won't you consider being one of them?

If you want to be official and look at the Book of Order for the Presbyterian Church (USA), ruling elders "are chosen by the congregation to discern and measure its fidelity to the Word of God, and to strengthen and nurture its faith and life." Sounds official, doesn't it? But it isn't. It's what I've mentioned above. It's you and I serving together in a church reaching out to a community. It isn't difficult, and we have fun too. All it really requires is faith, and isn't that really what we're all about?

I'd like to close with the first verse and chorus of a favorite hymn of mine, "Here I Am, Lord".

I, the Lord of sea and sky.
I have heard My people cry.
All who dwell in dark and sin,
My hand will save.
I who made the stars of night.
I will make their darkness bright.
Who will bear My light to them?
Whom shall I send?

Here I am, Lord. Is it I Lord?
I have heard You calling in the night.
I will go, Lord, if You lead me.
I will hold Your people in my heart.




Thank You from Presbyterian Women (PW)
