From your Session

September generally finds us with children back in school, high school football teams eager to prove their abilities, and hope for cooler weather. Not this year, however, though the return to classrooms is drawing near. Schooling may mean a classroom or a computer at home. Football may be played but perhaps without fans. Major changes in our lives. About the only thing we can count on is that the weather is hot but there is still hope for a cooler September!

In the past six months, we've been asked to make a lot of changes in our lives. Even at church, we've seen changes. Some of us need to be safe at home and attend via Livestream or Zoom while others are able to come in person following certain guidelines. Through it all, one thing never changes and that is the love of God for us, his children, and our love for Him. We know He will see us through this.

Part of knowing that God will see us through this is knowing we have a commitment as well. We know that following Jesus doesn't necessarily require a church building or acreage or a large congregation. Where two or three are gathered in my name, says the Lord, I am with you. But, and it's a pretty big one, we do happen to have a building and property we need to maintain. When we promised to love the Lord our God with all our heart and mind, we weren't perhaps thinking of painting or paving or mowing. Nevertheless, they are there. Some we can do ourselves and others we need to outsource.

In the past year, I'm sure you noticed,

the sanctuary has been repainted, the lighting throughout all buildings changed to LED, the roof repaired, etc. We also work hard to keep our technical resources performing at their best. As Marna noted in a recent article, there is a team in place working to improve the Livestream broadcast. Just now, as you know, the parking lot is being repaired. The project was started about two weeks ago and after the repairs began, it was determined we needed to do considerably more than initially planned. As a result, the cost increased from \$13,400 to \$21,800. In this year's budget we allocated \$10,000 toward parking repairs and have raised another \$5,000 toward the cost. We made a request for donations toward the \$3,400 initially but that request has grown to \$6,800. If you are so inclined to make a contribution toward parking lot repairs, please do.

Another project about to happen is a new electronic sign which will replace the large sign along the Wheatland Road portion of our property. The new sign will be electronically controlled through the office and will mean a big improvement not only in the sign itself but in the messages that appear. No more climbing up the ladder to change the message! Funds for both the sign and the installation of it were donated to the church. The sign has been ordered and once received will be installed. There is a "sign" team in place to coordinate all the details, both physical and technical.

Along with major improvements, such as the above, come the routine care and maintenance of the buildings and property just as we have with our own homes. We have some wonderful folks who volunteer time outdoors mowing and trimming and watering. When a recent downpour caused water to enter the CE Building, volunteers quickly assessed the situation, determined the problem, and repaired it permanently. Others volunteer as needed at special times for specific chores. Over the past six months, volunteers have assisted with specific responsibilities to make sure our buildings meet the health requirements for COVID 19. There are lots of different opportunities!


As a result of all the work of volunteers, whether it be through your physical labor or your monetary donations, we are able to keep our buildings and property in good condition. That's not only good for

us but good for the community. After all, we want to be a member in good standing of our community. We've done this in the past through our involvement in major community events and currently through our Parking Lot Prayer Ministry. Additionally, because we do maintain our facilities, in August, there were three events (one wedding service and two memorial services) where our facilities were utilized by others outside our church family.
