From your Session

Well, I'm thinking I'm supposed to wish everyone a Happy Thanksgiving as we get to the time of year that most of us, myself included, usually consider some of the best two months of the year. November and December, the time to celebrate Thanksgiving and Christmas while eating turkey, opening presents, and spending time with our family and friends. But this is 2020, a year like no other, where we seem each day to be faced with a life revolving around a COVID virus, a divisive political environment, an economy that seems to be deteriorating, and many instances of civil unrest. Sometimes we just want to scream "what is going on here!"

We as Christians believe and rejoice in the comfort that God is always in control. But sometimes we may seem to ask "Where is God" and "How can this be part of His plan?" One thing I try to go by is that God is different from us in that, He knows what will happen while we react to what is happening. How can we understand this?

Our Sunday School Class is currently trying to work our way through the short little Book of Ruth. It occurs to me that this book is a clear example of this viewpoint. In the book, we see a story that revolves around Naomi, Ruth and Boaz, but there is also another less focused on character, Obed. Obed, is the grandfather of David the future King of Israel. But let's look at Naomi and Ruth first.

Naomi and her family move from Israel to Moab in order to escape a famine that is going on at the time. So, she and her husband and two sons take off to get away from the famine. We are led to believe that life is pretty good for them as they relocate. Sadly, Naomi's

husband dies but her two sons have married local Moabite women, one of which is Ruth. Once again Naomi sees unfairness in her life when the two sons die, leaving just Naomi, Ruth and the other daughter-in-law. Naomi says, "What to do? I know, I'll head back to Israel and see if I can't survive by myself back in Israel." One daughter-inlaw stays, but Ruth says she will go with her. As Naomi arrives back in Bethlehem, she is an angry and bitter woman. Most of her anger and bitterness is aimed at God for not providing a better life for her. Ruth a loyal, loving daughter goes to work gleaning fields for their food and wellbeing. God makes sure that she is directed to a field that is owned by Boaz, who is the "kinsman redeemer". He makes sure she is safe and able to get ample food for her and Naomi. Boaz falls in love with Ruth and marries her. They then have a son whom they name Obed, who is the father of Jesse, who is the father of David.

To me, Naomi is reacting to life as it is presented to her, and at times, it seems difficult and unfair. God sees life not only from Naomi, but also from Obed, David, and the ultimate birth of Jesus Christ.

We see other examples of God in control when we see the journeys of Abraham, the kidnapping of Joseph, the hard heartedness of Pharaoh, and the lack of conviction by Pontius Pilot. Whatever are the results of this virus or election, we will do our part, but it is a part in God's ultimate, perfect plan. Rest comfortably knowing that everything is as it is supposed to be.


- Requests for at least ten orders "to go" will be required before we start cooking. (An order can be just one meal, or more, of course.)
