### The Center of the Home, The Center of the City

Each year at Christmas, my family puts up an English Village in the living room by the front window. It is a lot of trouble to unpack and arrange each piece with all the "people" that make it come to life. I recruit whomever I can find to help build it. Each year a new piece is added, sometimes a building but often now, as small as a streetlight, a caroler, or a child with a sleigh.

While the look of the village changes every year and with each addition—or the creativity of that year's builder—one thing remains the same: on the highest spot in the back row is the town's church. A tree stands beside the church with two cardinals sitting on its bare, snowcovered branches. In front of the church the pastor hands out a loaf of bread to an old woman and a small child who together seek help from the church. The child holds up her apron to receive the bread. Lights in the church illumine glowing crosses in its windows. Carolers adorn the main walkway. The mood is festive and bright with gift-giving, singing, sleigh riding, eating and dancing.

As I look at this village each year, especially considering this year's events, I realize the meaning of hope behind each piece. Cardinals are known as the Christmas bird, their scarlet feathers brightening the entire landscape as they perch themselves against a barren, snowy backdrop.

It reminds us of the crimson blood of Christ, which beckons us to remember that He has become our peace in all circumstances. The bread offered by the church is the physical sustenance of our spiritual need each day brings. The town offers gifts of sacrifice amidst the joy of song.

So many of the activities of the little English village represent the gift that has been given to us by God our Father—the Lord Jesus Christ and His church. The entire city is affected by Christ's church, which stands strong on the hill as if a sentinel constantly watching over the city. The church inspires hope for all the city's citizens, rich and poor alike; healthy and needing healing; lonely and needing love, filling us all with the hope of a certain future. My hope for you this Christmas season is that you enter the church and your soul becomes full; and then you exit the church to reach out and offer the same hope to the people in your city. May all these symbols of our Lord's birth warm your heart this year.
