Finding God in the Chaos

At around 5:30 in the evening on December 10, 1914, a massive explosion erupted in West Orange, New Jersey. Ten buildings in the legendary inventor Thomas Edison's plant were engulfed in flames. Everything was a total loss. According to Edison's son Charles, he couldn't find his dad. Frantically looking for his father and thinking, where could his father be? He found his father looking at the fire and with excitement he told his son, "Go, find your mother and bring her here! She'll never see a fire like this!"

Wow! As a Christian what would your response be? Remember, there were no computers to back up files of his inventions. There wasn't a cloud to bring back important information. Again, everything was a TOTAL loss.

Around 640 BC, Jeremiah wrote the book Lamentations as he was an eye witness to the destruction of Jerusalem. Seeing his countrymen being taken captive, he was in despair, he was depressed, and he felt hopeless. "My strength and hope have perished from the Lord" (Lam. 3:18).

In the midst of chaos, in the midst of his anguish, Jeremiah does three things that are a good reminder for us today in 2022:

He remembers (Lam. 3:20-24). As his soul sinks, he remembers at the same time the faithfulness of God! Therefore, he finds hope in God!

He waits (Lam. 3:25). He knows the goodness of God and His character, therefore he trusts God to make a way.

He seeks God (Lam. 3:25b).
Instead of allowing the pain and his emotions to run amok, he seeks God actively as he waits on God's deliverance.

Back to Thomas Edison. The damage was determined to be a loss of \$900,000 which would equal about \$23 Million in today's dollars. His response was, "We have an opportunity to erase our mistakes and start over." And he did, starting the very next day. Jeremiah in Lamentations, gives a reminder of God's faithful love for His people. "Through the Lord's mercies we are not consumed, because His compassions they fail not. They are new every morning. Great is your faithfulness" (Lam. 3:22, 23).

Yes, even in the midst of chaos, we can find God's abiding presence, which comforts us, and empowers us to walk in victory despite our circumstances!

An Interview with Roy Watson Excerpts from FPCD Interviews on Faith, Family, and Friends

What is one of the most important lessons you've learned in life?

Roy: If you are a Christian, and you say you trust God, you've got to trust God. That's the hardest thing for me to do, especially when I don't see it happening, or especially when I feel it should go the way I think it should go. I've learned from experience, that when I do things out of God's will, it has consequences, and sometimes those consequences last through your life. And that's just the facts. It doesn't mean God doesn't love me, and it doesn't mean God isn't going to use me, but there are just some things that you do in life that the consequences stay with you.

On being who you are in church:

God made us all different. Everybody's not going to raise their hands and shout "Amen!" Just be real. This is God we're worshiping. I love going to church. I spend my whole week on the battlefield of being beat down and tired and worn out. When I come to church, I look forward to seeing people. I want hug on them. This is where I want to be. I'm happy! I'm joyful! I want to get my praise on! I want to sing! I want to clap!

Can you tell us about a time God answered prayer in your life?

One of the most amazing stories in my life was when I first got saved. I was in the Infantry (Marine Corp), and we were always training to fight. We went to Bridgeport, CA to train, and you'd think it would be sunny, but it was one of the coldest places I've been to in my life. We had what's called Mountain Warfare Training, where you have to learn how to cross rivers and go from one mountain to another, all out in the elements. It was just cold, I mean cold, cold. I'm from Jersey, and I thought it was cold in Jersey. I'm telling you, it was just madness. We get over the com there's a storm was heading our way. Keep in mind, we're on top of the mountain. There's no way we can get down in time. We had to do the very best we could to cover ourselves because there was no way we could get out of this storm. Now, when you start seeing lieutenants, captains, and colonels being afraid, you know this is serious.

I was scared, and (my friend) Buchanan was with me and he said, "We gotta pray." Me, Buchanan, and Lance Corporal Jenkins went into this little shack to pray. Mind you, I just got saved, so I don't really know how to do this prayer thing. I don't know what happened, but the Holy Spirit came over me, and I took over and I started praying and yelling. I was drenched in sweat, and when we walked outside, it was lit (the sky). The storm, you could see it from a distance....it was gone.

On Miracles

I know for a fact that God does miracles. There's been times when me and my wife had no money. We had bills and we had this and we had that. My wife was a stay-at-home mom, and she said, "Roy, it's time for me to go to work". I said, "No, we made a deal that you were going to stay home and help raise the kids while I go out and work". She says, "This is not working, we're getting behind, we're getting in debt". I said, "Vonda, let's just pray, okay? And I promise you, when we get done praying, there's a knock at the door. I go to the door, and all I see is tail lights. So, I don't even know who it was. I look down and there's an envelope full of money, almost the exact amount of what we needed.

I've got plenty of stories like that I've seen firsthand, of what God can do.
