Advent - God provides

In this past year, we have gone through a lot of change as a church. Our pastor retired, and we began the search for a new pastor. As a congregation we banded together, planned services each week, and church continued! All the while, we prayed and hoped for a new pastor, knowing that in His timing, the Lord would provide. As a member of the staff and the Pastor Nominating Committee, I got a front row seat to this process and to all the things the Lord accomplished in and through our church. It was a hard year, but so full of blessing. Time and again, God has shown up! He has always been at work, and continues to do so.

This year, we have needed to fill the pulpit each Sunday with guest speakers, and at least once a month we needed an ordained Presbyterian minister scheduled so we could have communion together. We also needed an ordained Presbyterian minister to moderate our Session and Congregational meetings, moderate the calling of new elders, and moderate the calling of a new pastor. God provided!

Starting around Easter, we felt the need for a new worker for the nursery, because we had new attenders who had small children. We asked for volunteers to assist Ana in the nursery while we looked for a second worker, and you stepped up and filled in where needed. We prayed and asked around, and by July, we had a new nursery worker. God provided!

In the summer, when our elders rolled off, we worried that it would be hard to find replacements in this season of transition, but the Lord provided new elders!

Now December has come, and Advent is

here. What is Advent? Well, according to the dictionary, advent (with a small "a") is "the arrival of a notable person, thing, or event." It is when something important happens. In the Christian tradition, Advent (with a big "A"), is a time of hopeful waiting and preparing for the birth of Christ – and also for His Second Coming. It is a time of waiting. Waiting – what a familiar word. I'm sure all of you have experienced your own seasons of waiting for the advent of something important, as you sought a spouse, or a career path, or God's guidance in myriad other ways. We have done a lot of that as a church recently too, as we waited on God's timing and choice for a new pastor.

On Sunday, December 3, our Pastor Nominating Committee presented a pastoral candidate to the congregation, and you voted and approved the nomination. Our wait is nearly over. Yet again, God has provided!

The Season of Advent ends with the birth of Christ, which we celebrate on Christmas Day, and which brings Christ's love and hope for the whole world. Christ coming to earth, living a perfect life and dying for our sins so we could have relationship with God was the ultimate way God showed His love for and provided for us.

This season, as we celebrate Advent, let us think about all the ways God has come through for us. What have we waited on Him for that He has provided? What has He done that we didn't even think to pray for, but He knew we needed?

A Christmas Poem For You


Though the presents are shiny and the paper is bright




