"During Lent, we ask God to show us the world as it is." This is how theologian Kate Bowler introduces Lent to a reading audience who perhaps is not familiar with the concept of Lent. She continues "Suddenly, all of us are on the losing team. And we look at each other with the well-earned wonder, horror, and awe. We begin to tell each other the truth again: life is so beautiful and life symbolic of the time Jesus spent with is so hard. For everyone."

I agree with Kate, Lent is also my favorite part of the church calendar. Each Lenten season we are invited to consider what Jesus did for us, truly did for us. Not just on the cross, but throughout his whole ministry. Not just bite sized pieces that we snack on in a devotional that covers a Gospel or an Epistle, a letter from one of the apostles, but we step back, then journey forward with Christ alongside his ministry, alongside his actions that he completed all while knowing where he was headed. Where he was headed. And his healing, his teaching, his dying he did for our sake. And for the sake of those who followed him before us and for the sake of those who will continue building the body of Christ after we are long gone. Lent is big picture time. I love it. It has all the feelings: confusion, awe, excitement, intrigue,

love, devotion, politics, pain, betrayal, and did I mention, love?

Lent is important, it is important because it reminds us of who we were both before we were followers of Christ and then those who were resurrected in Him. A lot of talk of denying yourself will come up when Lent comes up. Lent is forty days, yes, the Devil in the desert, but it is also forty days of meditating upon his whole ministry. Living with Jesus does involve of us shedding habits, desires, and perceived needs in order to be free to be agile enough to follow his will and guidance. But, as we continue to learn about Jesus from the eyes of Peter in our Lenten sermon series, we also see that we will fail at letting go, we will give into being afraid, we will want to be comfortable more than anything in the world. Which is why we need Lent, which is why we do need to see the world as it is, not always as we want it to be.



PROPERTY – CAN YOU HELP?

As you know from the annual property report, there are two upcoming projects scheduled that will be completed by contractors: repair of the damaged area in the Sanctuary and replacement of the outside door from the CE classroom to the nursery. Additionally, there are other projects that we could do ourselves, such as:

- Replacement of stained or damaged ceiling tiles in the Narthex, sound room and Sacristy from earlier roof problems now resolved. Perhaps 8 to 10 tiles in all. We'll provide the tiles.
- Repainting of the lettering on the E. Freemen Street sign. We'll provide the paint.
- Repair of the door handle on the door from the CE Hallway to the courtyard.
- Clean out the storage area in the back of the CE wing where the riding mower is housed.
- Take the two boxes (heavy) of used electronic plates (they were replaced by new ones) from our electronic sign to Duncanville Hazardous Waste collection on Saturday, March 23.

In addition to tasks noted above, it would be nice to ...

- Have some volunteers to move the trash from the outside receptacles to the street once a week;
- Have some volunteers to walk around the property perhaps weekly or every other week to pick up trash;
- Have some volunteers to check inside to change a lightbulb (as needed and if accessible) and/or to report an issue;
- Have some volunteers who can be called upon when an emergency occurs.

If there's something you can do, please let us know. We'll call a plumber or an electrician or a contractor when needed, but sometimes **WE JUST NEED YOU!**
