We start making lists—of things to buy, plans to make, people to see. And if we're honest, those lists can sometimes slip into our spiritual lives too. We start wishing God (and maybe even the pastor) would deliver everything just the way we'd like —a pumpkin -spiced church, if you will.

Which brings me to this month's confession: I'm not Santa Claus. (Bet that was not on your bingo card as a confession.) Do not let the 4X4 SUV, full of small people, their toys, and papers that inevitably fall out the door, fool you. I don't have a sleigh, elves, or a list (though if I did, you'd all be on the "nice" one). My calling isn't to deliver a wish list on demand but to help us listen for what *God* is giving.

Sometimes we treat faith like a list we hand to God—asking for comfort without change, blessings without burden, joy without the journey. But the Gospel doesn't work that way. God invites us into a story far richer than our requests: one where generosity grows our hearts and service stretches our faith. The best gifts of God don't always come wrapped the way we expected—they come disguised as opportunities to love, forgive, and build something beautiful together.

As we head toward stewardship season, that truth matters. The church isn't a department store, and ministry isn't a wish list. It's a shared calling—one where every person brings their gifts, creativity, and heart so that together we become a living sign of God's love in Duncanville and beyond.

So, thank you for your prayers, laughter, and partnership in ministry. You remind me every day that God's best gifts aren't wrapped in paper but in people. And that, friends, is far better than anything that fits under a tree, in a pumpkin, or in a turkey.

October: Pregnancy and Infant Loss Awareness Month

October is **Pregnancy and Infant Loss Awareness Month**, a sacred time to honor the lives of children who were gone too soon. Throughout this month, families and friends come together to remember, grieve, and celebrate the lives of their little loved ones in meaningful ways.

This observance reminds us of the importance of walking gently with those who carry, what can be for many, invisible grief. By breaking the silence around pregnancy and infant loss, we create space for compassion, prayer, and healing—for parents who mourn, and for those who may not know how to express their sorrow.

Each year, far too many families experience this heartbreak. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, about 1 in 4 pregnancies end in miscarriage, and 1 in 160 births result in stillbirth. These numbers remind us that such loss is more common than we might realize—and that no parent should ever have to grieve alone.

Pregnancy and Infant Loss Awareness Month began in **1988**, when President Ronald Reagan issued a national proclamation, recognizing that there are no words for parents who lose a child (in English). He wrote:

"When a child loses his parent, they are called an orphan. When a spouse loses her or his partner, they are called a widow or widower. When parents lose their child, there isn't a word to describe them."

In addition to the month-long observance, **October 15** is recognized as **Pregnancy and Infant Loss Awareness Day**, when families across the nation participate in candlelight vigils and remembrance walks to honor their children's lives and stand alongside one another in love.

As a church, may we continue to be a community where grieving families find comfort, prayer, and a safe place to remember.

- **Light a candle at 7:00 PM** for the global *Wave of Light*, remembering babies gone too soon and praying for their families.
- **Share a name for prayer.** If you'd like your child's name included in our congregational prayers, please contact the church office or note it on a connection card.
- **Remembrance table.** You're welcome to bring a small note or symbol to place on our table of remembrance this month.
- **Pastoral care.** If you're grieving, you're not alone. Reach out to Pastor Rachael or the church office for prayer and care.
